The Evans House, 314 Maitland Ave., faces east in a shady block of Fulford Park. It is a 2 bay, 2 story clapboard four-square; its hipped dormer has 2 windows. The hip-roofed porch is carried on 3 square posts linked by a square post balustrade. Windows, flanked by paneled shutters, are 3/1 double-hung sash, doubled in the north bay of the facade. Entry is in the south bay. A partially enclosed shed porch is in the south bay of the rear.

The early 1920s saw three new additions to the Town of Bel Air: Fulford Park (1922), Ingleside (1923), and Kenmore (1924). In each case the lots were sold at auction. Fulford Park was subdivided by Oliver T. Wallace of Wilmington, North Carolina. The local agent was W. M. Nicholls. It was named for the Fulford family whose land it once was. The Evans House is a typical four-square, similar to those being built in Town in the 1920s and 1930s. It was probably built in the early 1930s by or for William Doxen, who mortgaged the property in 1932 for \$2500. He sold it in December 1933 to Ralph and Della Evans.


