Located at 2935 Level Road, Churchville, MD, this elementary school is a one story brick building composed of several construction periods. The original section dates to 1931, designed by John B. Hamme. The majority of the square footage exists from non-historic expansions in 1953 and 1962, which extend from the original linear footprint and run perpendicular to the 1931 section. The entrance pavilion displays the most ornamentation with Georgian Revival influence. Total window replacement with non-sympathetic windows along with interior alterations reduce the integrity of this structure. Located outside of Churchville, there does not appear to be a an immediate neighborhood associated with the school. Hamme, the architect of the original section, has other known works such as the Darlington and Slate Ridge Schools, Hood College and Bel Air Armory. Based on the submitted information, school does not appear to be eligible.
