Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: *(Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)*

Building 379 is a two story, two bay, frame structure sheathed in aluminum siding. The building is oriented to the south. The façade is pierced by a half-light, vinyl door in the right-hand bay and a one-over-one double-hung sash, vinyl window to the left. The second level is symmetrically fenestrated with identical windows. A shed-roofed porch supported by wooden posts shelters the first floor openings. The side elevations contain three openings in each level. Single-light, double-hung, vinyl-sash windows fill the openings. The building is covered by a shallow-pitched gable roof. Constructed in 1987, Building 379 measures 30 by 60 feet and serves as a general purpose administrative facility. Due to operational security concerns, photography of the building was not allowed.

Building 379 was evaluated against National Register guidelines to determine if it retained those qualities of significance and integrity to merit further consideration for eligibility to the National Register. This building bears no direct association with important themes at Aberdeen Proving Ground (Criterion A);

research did not reveal any associations with individuals important in Cold War history (Criterion B); and, the building does not possess the distinctive characteristics of a type, period or method of construction (Criterion C). Additionally, Building 379 is not 50 years old, and must satisfy Criteria Consideration G to merit further consideration for National Register eligibility. Building 379 does not possess exceptional importance to meet the threshold requirements of Criteria Consideration G. Building 379 served as a support structure, secondary to the primary mission of Aberdeen Proving Ground in the Cold War Era. This structure does not possess the qualities of significance or integrity for listing in the National Register of Historic Places.
