DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Archer Building is on the south side of Courtland Street across from the courthouse in Bel Air, Harford County, Maryland. It is a five bay, two story brick building with a hipped roof with an interior chimney, newer than the building, inside the east elevation. The front (north) elevation shows double-hung 6/6 windows flanking a vaguely Greek revival entry with long, three pane window lights, a six-pane transom and double doors, paneled below, glass above. The west elevation, on the alley is window-less; the east elevation is up against the next building. The rear (south) elevation is made up of three bays. The outside bays, containing a pair of double-hung windows on each level, (some 6/6, some 2/2, some 1/1 apparently as they needed to be replaced) flank the central bay, with a 6/6 double hung window in the stair landing and an 8'5" x 14'3" single story gable roofed shed which contains a bathroom on each side of the hall leading to the rear door.

The interior is a central hall plan with two offices on each side. A dog-leg open-string staircase rises along the west side of the hall. The turned newel post, balusters and stair rail are original. Upstairs, besides the two offices on each side of the hall, there is a small chamber of probably 20th century origin over the first floor entry.

When Major Robert Archer bought the building in 1925 he made sever renovations. He moved the three outside steps indoors, adding paneling below the window lights and dropping the doors to ground level. He also added two swinging doors at the top of the steps inside. He had a cellar excavated, placed the cellar door and steps under the hall stair-case, added central heating, electricity and the rear shed containing the bathrooms. The four cellar windows were installed at this time. The interior is remarkably untouched except for the paneling of Mr. Leo Sullivan's office and the replacement of three upstairs doors. In the cellar one may observe a thick layer of plaster and animal hair, placed between the floor and subflooring for insulation.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This remarkably preserved pleasantly situated office building is the only nineteenth century building in the square around the courthouse which retains its original function. It was built shortly after the Civil War, by Herman Stump and Henry Archer as lawyers offices. In every generation at least one Archer lawyer has occupied one of its offices, among them Henry W. Archer, James J. Archer, Major Robert Archer, and at present, J. Glasgow Archer, Jr. The building is currently owned by attorney J. Leo Sullivan and his daughter Mrs. Margaret Lucas. For the first time in 110 years no Archer holds an interest in the building. Brief biographies of prominent owners or occupants are attached.

The case was the result of the tangled inherited shares in the property as the result of the deaths of Henry W., Robert, and James J. Archer who had undivided thirds of the property. As an example of the confusion, Elizabeth A. Bruen and Anna de Goll each had the right to 11/90 of the property absolutely and 1/90 for life. The suit settled what percentage each claimant was entitled to and forced sale and distribution of the proceeds.


