Built in 1920 this large wood-frame, two-story house has a mixture of traditional and Queen Anne style elements, with a rectangular plan, hipped roof and cross-gable dormers. The wrap-around porch appears to have originally wrapped three sides of the building, but the right side was at some point enclosed and an entry door added. The dwelling is symmetrical, five bays wide with a central entrance. The entry door has a transom light and full-length side lights. There are two pairs of windows on the second floor, spaced evenly on the front elevation. On the left side first floor there is a single double-hung window and a bay window toward the rear. There is a chimney to the rear left of the house. A gable dormer with diamond pattern window sits directly over the small gable at the centered front porch entry.


