Another building across the street was, during later times, a general store run by Jones' grandson, Fred, from which he dispensed cigars and home-made soap.

The house shows many Federal influences and has been altered very little through the years. Perhaps the most noticeable change is in this **structure's** roof. The southeast gable end of the slate roof was originally hipped. It now has a frame gable.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This el-shaped rubblestone house is located on Castleton Road. Its eastern boundary borders on the Susquehanna River. The house faces southwest.

This dwelling is two stories high and has a slate roof. The gable flank roof was originally hipped on the southeast end but was altered by the present owners to add a frame gable with one attic window. This hipped roof may still be seen in the attic - it was not removed. Two corbeled brick chimneys are present. One is located on the northwest gable end, flush with the wall. The other chimney is located on the southwest wall of the eastern wing.

The coursed rubblestone dwelling has large, plain quoins at all corners. Large granite lintels are above both windows and doors. Large granite stones can also be seen on all sides of this house forming a horizontal line near the roofline. Directly above this granite feature is a stepped brick cornice. There are three rows of brick headers. Two iron tie rods dissect the house near the principle entrance. These are also visible inside the house, in the hallway near the ceiling.

The principal facade, the southwest side, is five bays long. The windows are two lights over two and have louvered shutters. The main entrance is in the center bay. The door is new and it also has new louvered shutters. An entrance porch protects this passage and is one story high. The flat roof has a balustraded deck. The window located on the south end of this facade was a door prior to the present ownership.

The southeast facade includes the el. A door had been located on this side's third bay but was changed into a window by the present owners. A door still exists on the opposite facade, however. A Bulkhead cellar entrance is located at the south end.

The northwest facade has had a modern one story frame kitchen added to it. This replaces a dilapidated frame shed which, although not original to the house, had been there for some time.

The facades which form the right angle of this el-shaped home originally had a two tier porch. This was altered and now is a single tier porch with columns being two stories high.

Changes inside this house are minimal. All but the dining room floors are the original hardwood. The plaster on stone walls were insulated. One passage was moved toward the middle of the hall and widened. And a modern bathroom was installed on the second floor.

The northwest room, the dining room, has a large plain fireplace which had been closed for many years. The present owners opened it up again. A large cooking crane found in the fireplace might indicate that this room was originally a kitchen.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The granite and sandstone house at Grey Rock Farm was built by Hugh A. Jones in the early 1830's. Jones was a mill wright and seems also to have managed with his brother, Charles Wesley, a Hotel and Bar directly across the street from his home for the convenience of fishermen and travelers. Another building across the street was, during later times, a general store run by Jones' grandson, Fred, from which he dispensed cigars and home-made soap.

The building of the Conowingo Dam caused the submersion of the mill, mill race and log dwelling associated with the tract in question, Brother's Discovery. The buildings associated with the mill industry are not shown on either Jennings and Herrick Map of 1858 or the Martenet Map of 1878. Warehouses are mentioned on the 1878 map. These are located near the Conowingo Bridge and the Canal.

The house shows many Federal influences and has been altered very little through the years. Perhaps the most noticeable change is in this structure's roof. The southeast gable end of the slate roof was originally hipped. It now has a frame gable.

 There are two chimneys. One is in the north
 gable end. The location of the other suggests that a
 smaller house might have consisted of just this
 east wing.

Additions to the north end of the house
 have closed off sunlight from the north-east
 porches.
