Description of Property and Justification: *(Please attach map and photo)*

Although identified on the Maryland SHPO Harford County map as HA-262, no other documentation of the property was found. The property was most recently observed on May 09, 2003. The house is a masonry hybrid two-story residential duplex, with basement. It presents itself with a continuous gable roof, running north-south, clad in slate and modern asphalt composition shingles. The oldest portion of the house appears to date from the mid-nineteenth century. The integrity of the house has been compromised by the addition of modern windows and doors, as well as by an incongruous mixture of building materials. For instance, the southern half of the building is constructed of native field stone, laid randomly. The front (east) elevation of the northern half of the building is faced in modern brick, laid generally in a running bond. Immediately as one turns the northeast corner of the house, however, the brick gives way to weathered cedar shingles. The northern end of the house extends into a two-story gabled ell, terminating in a modern open porch with shed roof that extends across the full extent of the rear of the house. The grade falls away to the rear of the house, allowing walk-out basement entries. A small, relatively modern two-level horse barn is located behind the house. Its lower level is constructed of concrete block, with a wood-framed upper level with a low-slope (roughly 3:12) gable roof with asphalt shingles. The upper level is covered with vertical weathered board siding. The property is not considered eligible for National Register designation under Criterion C because of its general lack of integrity. It is not known to be associated with any historic event, personage, or archaeological significance that would qualify it for registration under

- East front façade
- Building is 2 story plus basement.
- Left side of façade is stone cladding; right side is newer brick in running bond.
- Main gable roof running in north to south direction is slate shingles.
- Brick chimneys protrude main gable at north and south ends.
- Windows are predominantly single hung wood windows in wooden frames. Storm windows are single hung metal.
- Front patio is brick pavers, which appeared deteriorated.

- South and west back façade
- South façade is stone cladding.
- Large brick side chimney.
- Minor gable roof (east-west direction) and shed canopy over back porch are clad with asphalt shingles.
- Steel beam between stone pillar and bearing wall supports wood beams and portion of wood decking.
- Open frame wood steps with metal railings.
- Metal picket railings are around north deck at top of stairs.
- Wood picket railings surround southern portion of deck.
- North deck wall clad in wood shakes. Southern deck wall clad with vertical wood boards.
- Brick pavers under deck and at stair approach.

- Wood shakes covers north façade and 2nd floor rear. Wood shakes in need of refurbishing and staining.
- Foundation wall –CMU and stone veneer.





DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This structure is located on Flintville Road and faces east toward the Susquehanna River. The house consists of two main units, one of which is rubblestone, the other being frame construction.

The stone unit makes up the southern half of this rural apartment building. This unit is two stories high and is three bays by two. It has a gable flank, slate covered roof with a new, corbeled brick chimney located at the south, inside gable end. Windows in this unit are six lights over six. The principle entrance is in the center bay of the east facade. There is a stone addition on the west. This consists of an additional bay, a huge stone chimney and a porch across the west facade.

The frame unit of this house is covered with cedar shake shingles on all but the eastern exposure. This side is faced with a brick facade. The unit is two bays by two. The door and window sashes are replaced. This unit is also two stories high and covered with slate shingles. A new brick chimney is located on the north inside gable end.

A large rubble stone and frame barn is located to the north of the house. The main part of this barn is constructed of vertical board.

The roof is slate. The foundations are rubble stone. In the section to the west, the rubble stone foundations make up the ground floor level. There are four small windows and a door on the south side of the rubble wall.
