This rubble stone house is located at the end of a long lane off Hollingsworth Road. The main unit of this house is four bays by two and faces south.

This tract is generally associated with the Hollingsworth family who owned, at one time, over 1,000 acres of Claggett's Forest. The Hollingsworth family ran a wheel factory for many years on Winter's Run, near what is now Atkisson Dam. The company, J.C. Hollingsworth and Sons Company, also owned a gristmill at the same site. The factory was first run by water power but later a steam engine was installed. This factory was destroyed by fire near the turn of the century.

The house itself reflects the family's connections with Pennsylvania and its architectural influence. The family moved to Harford County from Chester County, Pennsylvania. The Mid-Atlantic house type shown is common enough: It is two rooms deep and has internal end chimneys and many other Georgian features, but it lacks the stylish trim and the broad open stair. The stair is confined to the corner of a room, the hallway is absent and rooms are laid out in continental plan. The house has four openings on the front of the first story, including the two front doors, a characteristic associated with that area from which the Hollingsworth family came.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This rubble stone house is located at the end of a long lane off Hollingsworth Road. The main unit of this house is four bays by two and faces south. The two story structure has plain quoins and a gable flank, wood shingled roof with a box cornice. Large corbeled stone chimnies are located at each inside end of the main unit. The chimney on the east end is flanked by attic windows 6 lights over 6, on the west side the attic windows are 3/6.

Entrance to this house is most commonly gained through the door on the west gable end. This door, a plain, moulded panel door with a brass knob, has a two light transom overhead. A pedimented, gable front entrance porch protects this entrance. The window on the first elevation of this facade is 6 lights over nine, as on most of the windows at this level.

On the south facade, two doors are in the center bays, each door is unusually wide and has four panes of glass in each. There are no transoms or side lights. Windows at the first elevation are 6/9; at the second elevation, 6/6. A narrow porch with two sets of steps is at the entrance. A slate patio with low, rubble stone walls is on the South side. Slate and stone steps lead into the formal gardens.

The north facade of this dwelling has irregular fenestration. Three windows are located at the first elevation of this side, each varies in their sash arrangement. The north west window is 6/9, the center window is 6/6 and the northeast window in 6/1.

The northern half of the east facade is visible. It has an exterior cellar entrance. The window on the first elevation is 2/1.

All doors and windows in this house are pegged and beading is also visible.

Inside, this unit is two rooms deep. The northwest room and southwest room both have beaded chair rails and moulded panel doors with brass knobs. A diagonal fireplace is in each room, a plain, pegged and beaded mantle is on each fireplace. Floors have been replaced. A door leads from the northwest room into a hall. A stairway is located on the west wall of the hall. A cellar entrance is at its base. Two doors are located on the south wall-each leading to a separate room. A window on the north facade has a wooden drawer at the base of the frame. North of the hall is a paneled den. This room is the most changed having had a small Water Closet added in the southwest corner of the room.

The dining room has a diagonal fireplace in the northeast corner. This is brick lined and has a plain, beaded mantle. A beaded chair rail and plain wainscoting is on each wall of this room. A very wide, pegged, 6 panel door is at the entrance to the kitchen unit.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

A plat of Bynum Run by Thomas White, dated 1725, shows "Claget's Forest" existed at that time. The date it was patented and the name of the patentee are not given, however.

This tract is generally associated with the Hollingsworth family who owned, at one time, over 1,000 acres of Claggett's Forest. The Hollingsworth family ran a wheel factory for many years on Winter's Run, near what is now Atkisson Dam. The company, J.C. Hollingsworth and Sons Company, also owned a gristmill at the same site. The factory was first run by water power but later a steam engine was installed. This factory was destroyed by fire near the turn of the century.

Local tradition has it that the Hollingsworth family lived in the small stone house (HA-298) just south of the house in question, until the larger house was completed. This is said to have been in the early 1800's. Some reports state that the house in question was completed in 1818 and others claim the year to be circa 1809. Every one agrees that HA-298 was in use soon after the turn of that century. The rather sketchy Maryland tax list of 1814 attributes 21 acres and 16 slaves in this area to Isaac Hollingsworth. His home is described as a two story stone dwelling measuring 50' x 30'. On the other side of the border, in the third election district, Nathaniel Hollingsworth is listed as owning 825 acres specifically mentioned as "Claggett's Forest." He is shown to have owned several dwellings, many of them old and of little account, and none specifically mentioned as stone though some are stated to be wood. A saw mill is also on the site at this time.

Judging from the 1814 tax list, it seems unlikely that the traditional story is true. Another difficulty stems from the re-routing of Hollingsworth Road. The modern road appears to be located west of the original. This area is also dissected by the boundary between the first and third county election districts, which seem to have moved back and forth between the early 1800's and the present day.

It is possible that the house presently in the third election district on the east side of Hollingsworth Road could be the same house shown on Martenet's map of 1878 in the first election district on the west side of Hollingsworth Road. It is also possible that Isaac Hollingsworth's home in 1814 could be Rev. Reipe's home in 1977.

The cellar under the main unit of the house is divided into several rooms—probably meant for cool storage. Diagonal stone fireplace supports are at the east and west ends. The supports on the west wall have semi-elliptical stone arches while a single support on the east wall is plain.

The kitchen unit, attached to the east end of the main house, is two bays long and one story high. The first elevation of this unit is lower than the main house and there are two steps leading down from the main house's dining room into the kitchen unit. This room is paneled with beaded boards. The floor has been covered. A large stone fireplace, painted white, is on the east wall. There is no mantle, only a large, pegged beam which does not protrude from the fireplace. There is a brick hearth and the original iron crane is still present. Entrance to the attic is obtained through a trap door above the fireplace. There is no cellar beneath this section.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

This size house, 4 bays x 2, is uncommon in Harford County, and has been found in this inventory so far only where the builder came from Chester or Delaware Counties in Pennsylvania, where it is common.

In this case Nathaniel and Abigail Green Hollingsworth came from near Cho and built their second house in about 1818 on their 1000 acres of land. The older house, about 200 yards to the east, was also stone, burned. ~~Four~~ generations of Hollingsworths lived here until Lewis Hollingsworth ^{widow Alice} ~~and about~~ sold the house ^{after} 1910. The second generation, ten children, had each received about 100 acres from their father.




