DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame dwelling, located on Harmony Church Road in Darlington, is shielded from the road by a thick curtain of evergreens. The house faces south. Many additions obscure the original two story, two bay frame house presently located in this dwelling's center.

Each section has an asphalt covered, gable flank roof. The oldest unit has a gabled dormer on the south side. The window sash is an unusual twelve over two. Three chimneys are located on the roof. One at each inside end of the center section and one at the east addition's gable end. The owners have replaced the original wooden shingles. They also had to remove the remaining black walnut logs of the oldest section due to termites. Windows in the old unit and the eastern library addition are six lights over six and have louvered shutters.

There are at least three more additions to this house representing styles of the late nineteenth century through to the 1930's and 40's. The original front door in the old unit has been closed up and another opening made about six feet south of the original. Stairways and fireplaces have been moved, altered and otherwise rearranged.

A beautiful two tier porch is located on the south end of the south addition.

The interior of this house reflects the many different ages represented here. The library addition has a moulded cornice and chair rails. Book cases cover most walls and flank the brick faced fireplace on the north wall. The mantle has Roman doric pilasters.

The main stairway, in the oldest unit, is a mid nineteenth century addition. It has a massive turned newel post and ornate scroll work. This room has chestnut and oak flooring, and covered beaded beams. The fireplace on the south wall has a moulded panel mantle and facing and large dentiles. It matches a fireplace found in the Proctor Home (HA-289).

The south room has a large fireplace on its north wall. This shares a chimney with the fireplace in the center room. Of interest is the width and depth of this fireplace (see floor plan). The mantle of this fireplace also has large dentiles. A large bay window in this room is an alteration.

Beams in the roof are pegged.

John Worthington purchase the longstanding county newspaper, The Aegis and Intelligencer, in 1904. This newspaper has remained in the same family.





STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

This frame house of many ages and additions has one part (1) reported as dating from 1720. With no fireplaces here now it seems obvious that an earlier kitchen was either attached (as at (2)) or very close to this house.

A farmer's house, grown to 3 sections with the farm economy of the 19th Century, later became a retirement house in the 1930's, the residence of a local industrialist in the 50's & 60's as daily commuting of about twenty miles ~~each~~ ^{way} became possible.






