DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Smith-Troutman House is a two story frame vernacular style house built about 1890 and located on the south side of Trappe Church Road about two-tenths of a mile west of the intersection with Darlington Road (Md. Route 161) near Darlington, Harford County, Maryland. The main elevation faces north.

The main section of the house is an irregularly shaped block roughly rectangular in shape. On the main elevation a one-story porch has been enclosed and a one story garage extension added to the east elevation. A third modern extension adjoins the south elevation. The upper floor and roof of the main section retain the original shingled exterior and perforated and sunburst brackets. The gables have an overlay of board trim derived from the ornamentation of the Stick style. The pattern is enhanced by the blue painted shingles and white boards and trim. The fenestration has been mostly replaced by modern sash, but a few "Queen Anne" style windows remain in the upper floor.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Smith-Troutman House retains some elements of a well-designed country estate house in a vernacular style combining elements of the Queen Anne and Stick styles. Although substantially altered, the proportions and remaining details echo the more spectacular neighboring estates, Westacre (HA-322) and Winstone (HA-323).

The land on which the house stands was part of the Westacre tract and was at different times owned by both D.C. Wharton Smith, Courtauld Smith, and Maria Troutman, all of whom owned Westacre at different times at the turn of the century. It is unclear at this time who actually built the house.

Note: Survey number HA-324 was originally assigned to the Winstone Coachman's House. Information on that building is consolidated under HA-323 (Winstone).






