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The frame and stone house six bays long and one room deep, is under one long A roof. Chimneys are at either end and in the center of the house where the stone wall meets the frame section.

The house faces away from the road to the south across the Deer Creek valley. The ridge line runs east-west.

The stone section, the western half of the house, was once three bays long, but now the door between two windows has been blocked up with stone. Windows in this part of the house are of over 6 lights. Three windows are upstairs on the south side of the house, but two remain on the north side of the house, and here another door has been closed up with masonry. Two small gable windows face west from the attic.

The frame part of the house - the eastern half - is three bays by one.

This rugged old house has been continuously lived in but has received

marginal attention over many years, judging from the fact that shutters are gone, window frames eroded under thin paint, stucco is washed off the fieldstone structure, showing at least two colors of ~~stucco~~ paint in poor condition.
