By virtue of its gable roof with varying pitches and overhanging gables, its variety of sheathing (i.e. German siding and scalloped shingles), the central brick chimney, and decorative windows with colored glass borders, the Matthews-Hall House can be identified as a proponent of the picturesquely eclectic styles for small houses or "cottages" of the late Victorian era.

It was probably built in the late 19th century by Samuel and Ruth Matthews or by Joshua Matthews on the 123-acre farm comprising part of the tract, "Bachelors Good Luck". The Matthews-Hall House has few stylistic peers in the area around Deer Creek and is more sympatico with its contemporaries in and around Aberdeen.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 2-story el-shaped frame cottage of what can only be called eclectic picturesque style, is located on the east side of East Nobles Mill Road, between Nobles Mill Road and Trappe Church Road.

By virtue of its gable roof with varying pitches and shapes and series of overhanging gables, its variety of sheathing materials, i. e. German siding in the first story and scalloped shingles in the gables, the central brick chimney with a corbelled cap, and the decorative l/l sash windows with borders of small panes of colored glass around the upper sashes, this house can be identified as a proponent of the picturesquely eclectic styles for small houses or "cottages" of the late Victorian age.

The house seems to have been practically square originally, and the porch spanning the north and west sides was probably added and the south end filled in later to make the house el-shaped. An exterior brick chimney was also added at the juncture of the 1-room addition and the south facade of the original house.

A side-by-side description of the house is in order since each side is different:

The north facade has an entrance in the center bay, flanked by a window on each side. The east side has a door in the center bay with a window in the south bay, where there is a bulkhead entrance to the basement. The south side has 2 full-sized windows and the upper sash of a 3rd window in the 1st story. The overhanging gable has a second overhang in the gable peak and a pair of windows in the second story. The west side, partially covered by the one-room addition, has an entrance in the first story, a window in the 2nd story, and, above that, the gable again has a double overhang with a small single light replaced window in the lower gable.

The 1-story porch has posts with rock-faced concrete block bases and tapered, panelled shafts.

North of the house is a one-story shed with exposed eaves and machine sawn rafters. East of that is a gambrel-roofed barn and silo, also apparently early-to-mid 20th century.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

With its large expanse of intersecting roofs, series of overhanging gables, variety of exterior sheathing, ornamental windows, and central brick chimney, the Matthews-Hall House is a marvelous picturesque cottage with few peers in this part (i.e. the Deer Creek Valley) of Harford County. It was probably built in the late 19th century by Samuel and Ruth Matthews or by Joshua Matthews.

The 1878 Martenet's Map shows no structure in this location but there is one belonging to S.H. Matthews east of this location. In an equity case involving a mortgage default of S.H. Matthews in 1891, the 123 acre farm, part of the tract "Bachelors Good Luck", was sold to Tacy B. Matthews and Joshua Matthews.¹ In 1897, Ruth Matthews purchased the farm back² and in 1912, as a widow, sold it to Tacy B. Matthews.³ The farm stayed in the Matthews family until 1957, when it was sold to Marchant Hall. Prior to the ownership of Samuel H. Matthews, this had been the home farm of his uncle, Joshua Hopkins, who willed it to him in 1862 at the cost of \$65/acre.
