No connection can be made at this time, however, between the Tollgate House and the Jackson house.

Built sometime before 1858, it has one room to each of its three floors, the kitchen being in the basement level. In 1858 Nathaniel Hays, brother of Bel Air's wealthy merchant Thomas Hays, owned the house. For sale, it is severely threatened by expansion.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This small three and a half story stone rubble house with a tin gable roof is on the Toll Gate Road across from Harford Mall. It is approximately two bays by two bays and seriously deteriorated. Larger stone quoins mark the corner and flat brick arches top the flat wooden window surrounds. The windows are - or were - 6/6. The windows in the gables may have been 2/2. The east and west elevations are blind except for the gable windows. The main entrance was in the east bay of the second level on the south side. The door and the porch are gone. There are no marks on the stonework to suggest that the porch was anything but an uncovered stoop.

On the west side (away from the road) is a shed addition on the first level. The north half is enclosed in shiplap and is probably a pantry. The south half is a porch sheltering the entrance to this level.

Peering into this ruinous bulk, one can observe a large cooking fireplace in the west wall of the first level. The ruins of an inside end chimney appear on the roof in the west end. It appears that the kitchen was in the basement (or first level) and that there was one room on each level.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This tall, narrow stone house was built sometime before 1858. It appears on the map of that year as the property of Nathaniel Hays, brother to Thomas Hays, wealthy Bel Air merchant. Somehow, it seems doubtful that they lived there. It looks more like a tenant house. Why they built it of stone is a good question. Stone was not a common building material in the neighborhood. Hays died in 1863, and left the real estate in Maryland to his sister Harriet B. Hays and his nephew Stevenson Archer as joint tenants with right of survivorship. Harriet died in 1872.

Stevenson Archer sold the property to Patrick Howard in 1885 but did not record the deed. Howard had been living there at least since 1878, for his name appears on the map of that year, and possibly since Hays' death. Howard mortgaged the property in 1885 for \$400. In 1892, under pressure, Archer conveyed the property to Howard (63/211). Archer was in the penitentiary at the time; his recital of the facts of the case in the deed 63/211 is at variance with the will records, as a matter of fact. He swore that Maria Hays, Nathaniel Hays' wife, had a life interest. Since he was executor of Hays' will, he might be expected to know, but Hays left his wife only her dower according to the will as recorded. At any rate, it appears that the irregularity of this transaction did not come to light when Archer went to prison in 1890 but when Maria died in 1892. In any case, Howard finally got title in 1892 only to claim the insolvency laws in 1894. The trustees sold this property to Thomas H. Robinson that year (81/189). In 1908 Robinson sold it to J. Clay Jackson and George Willis James (125/57). Jackson bought James out in 1918 (160/442). The present owner is Edward P. Jackson, who inherited it from his father, J. Clay Jackson.

The house is in serious danger of demolition. It is for sale in a commercial-industrial area, and it is to be supposed that a buyer would be more interested in the site than in the building which is in bad condition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This drastically deteriorated, rubble stone dwelling is located on prime commercial property near the corner of Route 1 and Tollgate Road directly across the street from the Harford Mall. Needless to say, this house is probably not long for this world.

The house is two bays by one and has three levels and an attic. Large quoins are at the corners of the stone walls. The gable flank roof is slate. A wide, brick chimney is located on the west gable end flush with the wall.

Windows on the ground elevation are six lights over three. A door is located on the west facade where a one story lean-to with German siding serves as an entrance porch and storage bin. The door on this side is of beaded board and batten. A large stone lintel is above this entrance. Inside, this level consists of one room—a kitchen. Floors have been covered by several layers of linoleum. Walls are plaster over stone. A large stone fireplace is located on the west wall. A hole had been punched through the flue for a stove pipe. On the west wall there is a small closet and the entrance to the boxed in, winding stairway.

A hallway with a straight staircase and the parlor is located on the second elevation. Windows on this elevation are six lights over six. The principle entrance is located on the south facade. There is no longer a porch or steps leading to this door, however. A fireplace in the parlor has been altered for the use of a wood stove.

There are two rooms on the third elevation. Windows on this level are also six/six. Entrance to the attic is through a door on the east well of the landing. The enclosed, winding stairway to the attic is deteriorated. No survey was made of the attic. Windows are present in the attic: two-four light casement windows are on the west end, one 6/1 sash is on the east.




