DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This one story, rubblestone dwelling is in lamentable condition. Originally a carriage house, this building has been expanded and now includes a barn and totals eight bays in length. This structure faces east toward Old Joppa Road.

Stone used in this dwelling is of fine quality and is fairly evenly coursed. The slate roof is gable front and has very wide eaves. The principal entrance is in the center of the eastern facade. The deep set door is of vertical beaded board. A three light transom is overhead. The door is flanked by two windows, originally six lights over six and now six lights over one. These windows have granite lintels. The attic elevation of this facade has two six light over six windows as well. These also have granite lintels. The ends of roughly hewn logs, diagonally located from these windows, are visible on this facade. At the roof's peak is a date stone setting but that datestone has been removed by vandals. Iron braces are visible on this facade. A wide brick chimney is located on this inside end.

Scalloped eaves trim the roof line on the north facade. Openings on the north facade include a door at the first bay. This door is similar to the principal entrance; the transom, however, has been boarded up. Double hung wood plank iron strap hinged doors are located in the third bay on both the north and south facades.

Attached to the one story, five bay section of this structure is a two story, three bay, rubble stone barn. A large wood plank door is at the center on both the north and south facade of this barn. Windows in the barn are six lights over six.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This structure was once a stage coach stop for those travelling from Bel Air to Bush. During a Civil War invasion, Major Harry Gilmore led his confederate troops through Maryland and Pennsylvania, tearing up railroad tracks and destroying bridges along their way. On July 10, 1864 he crossed the Little Gunpowder and entered Harford County with twenty-eight men. They then camped in this stagecoach building at the junction of Mountain and Old Joppa Roads for **over night on their way** to burn the Pennsylvania Railroad Bridge across the Gunpowder River, where he captured General W.B. Franklin. A State Roads Commission historic marker point this out to passersby.

The architecture of this building is unique, providing living quarters, blacksmith facilities, carriage storage and a barn for the house




