DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This structure is located on a slope overlooking Maryland Route #161's descent towards the Deer Creek Valley. It is a single-story, hexagonal building of coursed fieldstone and quoined corners. The doorway is on the side directed due southwards, and single 6 X 6 sashes are located on each of the other five sides. The door is five-panelled, with a three-light transom overhead. The roof is a circular hip type, with asphalt shingles, and it is trimmed with a short frieze and eaves. A small shed-shelter covers doorway. Centered on the peak of the roof is a tile vent pipe.

Inside, there is almost no detail remaining, save for the old plaster on the walls and the evidence of where the slate boards once were. A single original cabinet does remain, located to the right of the doorway as one looks outside from the room.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This was a public school, constructed in the early 1850's by local residents. Joshua Stephens, the stonemason, supposedly built the unusually-shaped structure on a dare. A log building used as a school existed on the site before the existing one, and the former may have been the site of an 1837 meeting which discussed the proposed construction of nearby Harmony Church. The site was purchased in 1850 by the Harford County School Commission, and the school was erected under the process where the County provided one-third of the funds and the local residents the rest. Prospect school taught grades one through eight, the single room having a stove in the center, two rows of seats on each side of the stove, and the teacher's desk located at the wall opposite the door. The 1878 Martenet Map indicates the presence of the school, which operated until 1930.




