DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This building is a two-story structure with a an L-shaped wing on the northwest rear of the house. The rear wing has an addition attached to the east wall, recently built. The main section is three bays by two and the wing is two bays by one. The walls are of uncoursed rubble stone with flat brick arches over the windows and doors. The window openings are 6 X 6 and the frames and sashes are new. Attic windows of the same type are located on the eastern and western attic gables. The main entrance is on the south-east side and is centered in a five-panel bay structure, with two-pane side lights on either side of the door. The other egress is located on the western side of the rear wing. A three-bay shed-roofed porch is on the southern exposure over the main door, decorated with brackets. This porch once sat on stone pillars. A more rude shelter covers the western doorway. The roof is a gable flank, covered with wood shingles. The trim features a box cornice with a soffit and frieze and angled-in eaves. The brick chimneys are all recent; two are inside-ends on the eastern and western extremes of the main house and one on the northern inside-end of the wing. The entrance to the cellar is on the western side of the main house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is probably little more than 100 years old, but it is interesting in it's use of stone and brick flat arches over the windows, usually not found in most area rural homes. The 1878 Martenet Map shows the owner to be B. F. Minnick although the property owner at that time was really John Riley. The tract on which the house is located once belonged to John W. Spencer, who was a prominent commercial fisherman on the Susquehanna at Lapidum.




