DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The original part of this southern-facing structure is a two-story log structure with a one-story kitchen addition. It has since been added on to by a series of shelters, lean-tos and sheds throughout the years, composed of all materials imaginable. Some of the logs are pegged in this structure. It is three bays by one on the first floor, and two by one on the second level. Attached to the main section to the west is a one-story log addition with a stone cellar, adjoined to the main part via dovetailed logs. The second floor of the main section, incidentally, has been sheathed in bevelled frame. The windows are 6 X 6, in sashes not indigenous to the rest of the house. There are two southern entrances, one for each "wing". A third is on the north side of the larger section. The roof shelter is gable-flank and asphalt covered. A single, stout brick flue is on the western outside end of the two-story unit.

Interior

The single fireplace is in the center room and is stone at the bottom. It originally had a double hearth facing the one-story part. There is the presence of some beaded trim, and the flooring appears original. A winding stairway on the eastern end leads upstairs. The one-story unit was a kitchen at one time, featuring a lowered ceiling and beaded trim.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is located on the same tract of land as the Homestead (HA 591-594) and could possibly pre-date the main house, being a place of occupance while the larger and more elaborate stone house was being constructed. The tract itself was Aquila's Inheritance, and was once owned by Aquila Hall, an Activist during the Revolution. In 1769, James White Hall, son of Aquila, sold nearly 1000 acres of this tract to James Hall. The ownership of this place probably corresponded with that of the main house, and in 1878 a separate tenant is listed, Israel Waterman. This log structure is not only unique for it's age, but also for the fact that it is a full two stories.


