The Forwood-Lee House is significant for its architectural form in both the log structure of the south wing and the two-story porch under the roof of the north section. Log buildings surviving from the pre-1850 period are uncommon in Harford County. The porch detail is not unique, but unusual in an area where stone buildings predominated during the probable period of its construction. The house was owned prior to 1850 by Dr. Parker Forwood and, by virtue of his occupation and the house's location at a road intersection, it became a local landmark. Land records in the mid-19th century in the area often refer to "the road which leads to Dr. Forwood's".

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Forwood-Lee House is a two-story, two section frame and log house built about 1835 and located on the south side of Sandy Hook Road at the intersection of Scarboro Road in the vicinity of Scarboro, Harford County, Maryland. The main elevation faces northwest.

The north section of the house is a frame, two-story building with a two-story porch under the slate roof. Four bays with two entries divide the facade. An exterior chimney is located on the north gable end. A second chimney is on the south end, enclosed by the south section of the house. The porch posts are chamfered and the upper level has a plain balustrade. The windows are 2/2.

The south section is also two stories, but is in a smaller scale than the north section. According to the original survey form written in 1971, this part has a log structure and may pre-date the larger north section. The main elevation on the east has a door flanked by a single window and two windows on the upper floor. A shed porch with square posts and composition roof crosses the facade. At the rear of the house is a shed addition connected by an open porch with the rear of the larger north section.

The foundation is stone and the exterior of both sections is covered with aluminum siding. In 1971, the house still had clapboard siding.

About 40 feet southeast of the house is a stone springhouse with a shingled hipped roof and a projecting entrance on the north elevation. The building is generally square in plan and has a lower level where the spring-cooled troughs were. The upper level has a stone and brick chimney on the east side. On the west elevation is another door flanked by a single 6/6 window. The present owner believes the springhouse was built first, with the upper part added later for slave quarters. There is no visible evidence to support this theory. In 1971, the upper floor fireplace still had a crane and fire tools. The interior was not observed in the current survey. Two small frame sheds stand east of the springhouse.

South of the house and springhouse are several other frame outbuildings, the largest of which is a frame bank barn with a stone foundation, board and batten siding, and a metal roof. A shingle-roofed frame shed is west of the barn.

A frame garage or carriage house on a stone foundation stands west of the springhouse. Just outside its door is a circa 1925 gasoline pump of the "visible pump" type with a glass top, made by the Guarantee Liquid Measure Company of Rochester, PA. The glass cylinder is missing.

Frame house with log wing both covered with clap board of white pine. 12" wide 4" to the weather.

Oblong, 2 stories, 4 bays x 2 in the main house and 2 x 1 in the log wing, two front doors open north onto a double decker porch, the roof sweeps out over the upper deck as part of the house. The roof ridge line runs east-west.

Windows are 2 lights over 2 ^(again an 1880 feature) except that the attic windows at either end of the house are single sash, 6 lights, hinged at the side.

The house has 3 chimneys, each quite different size - the wing has an interior chimney, small at the top - is the original deep cooking fireplace still there? Two inside fresh chimneys rise from heating (?) fireplaces in the main house.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This stone masonry utility building served a succession of uses, apparently; a spring house downstairs under a room that was a dwelling a smoke house and perhaps slaughterhouse:

About 12' x 12', a hip roof has hand-split shingles over narrow eaves. The north wall has a window and a door to the one room upstairs. The east wall has a portico sheltering the entrance to the spring house. The south wall has a window upstairs, 6 lights over 6, and a wide low opening from the spring house. There is a huge exterior fireplace of stone topped by a brick chimney.

Inside the room upstairs has a small fireplace with crane and fire tools still hanging. The downstairs room has troughs for setting out crocks of milk and other food to be water-cooled. The spring is extinct, and water was evidently pumped from the well just 6' from the door on the north side into the troughs.

Although there is no ^{obvious} trace of change now in the wall masonry, Mr Cummings believes the spring house was built first, perhaps over an existing spring, the upper floor added for slave or servants' quarters later.

On the other hand it is possible that the chimney is the remaining part of an ancient wooden house, and its fireplace the original part.

In any case the structure was used and re-used to meet the needs of the day.

Today it is vacant and neglected but not because it is not appreciated - Mr Cummings is having a struggle managing his dairy farm with one aging farm hand.


