

## SUMMARY

This stone bank house, 3 bays wide and 2 bays deep, has been substantially re-modeled but may date to the third quarter of the 19th century. At that time the property was owned by Isaac W. Coale and Eliza Jackson, son and daughter of Skipwith Coale, whose holdings included "Westwood" farm and the "Hartley Farm" (see HA-145, 146, 675-677). The property was subsequently purchased by Susanna Roberts, who owned a flour mill on Glenville Road, as well as the George C. Davis house (HA-147, 148). Bank houses were fairly common in this area, and this one is *one of* a few that have retained their original form and have not been added on to.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This 1-1/2-story, gable-roofed fieldstone bank house is located on the north side of Glenville Road, west of the intersection with Old Level Road.

The house, substantially re-modeled, faces south and its ridgeline runs east-west. Three bays wide on the south side, two bays wide on the north, and one bay deep, the house is set into a hill so that it has a full ground story on the south side. The latter is spanned by a one-story shed-roofed porch in the first story, set on a foundation with modern casement doors and a window. An entrance is located in the first story center bay, flanked by windows on both sides. All windows have replaced modern sash. An interior end brick chimney is located in the west end; the roof has a raked cornice, also apparently new.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This stone tenant house appears to have been built around the middle of the 19th century either by Eliza Jackson or by Robert Bond, more likely the former. In 1856, Eliza Jackson, daughter of Skipwith Coale, received the part of "Westwood" farm referred to as lot #3 in the settlement of her father's estate.<sup>1</sup> (although Skipwith Coale died in 1832, his property was not formally divided up until the settlement of the estate of his son, William F. Coale, in 1856.) Lot #3 already had on it a substantial stone house, which became the residence of Eliza Jackson, as noted on the 1878 Martenet's Map of Harford County. There is no record that the 67-acre Lot #4, which is where this tenant house is, had any structure on it in 1856, when it was allocated to Isaac W. Coale, brother of Eliza Jackson.

The plats filed with the equity case settling William Coale's estate do not indicate a structure on Lot #4, while they do indicate structures on two other lots. The 1858 Jennings & Herrick Map is ambiguous: it shows two structures on the northwest side of Glenville Road, west of the Intersection with Old Level Road-- the northerly one belonging to I.W. Coale, the southerly one to Mrs. Jackson. The latter may or may not be this bank house, the former may or may not be "Westwood" (HA-675-677). The 1878 Martenet's Map indicates "Mrs. Jackson Res." where "Westwood" is; the intersection where the small bank house is located has been bleached out. In any event, the house was probably not built until after 1856, although it may have been constructed in time to show up on the 1858 Map. Isaac sold Lot #4 to her for \$3150 in 1864.<sup>2</sup>

Another clue (or red herring) may be the two mortgages Eliza Jackson took out on this lot, one for \$1260 and, one for \$1200, both in 1869<sup>3</sup>--perhaps indicating construction of the tenant house then.

In 1870, Eliza Jackson sold to Robert Proud "all the right, title, and estate to all her lands in Harford County" for \$800 and his agreement to pay all the liens on the property,<sup>4</sup> and 14 years later Proud sold to Susannah Roberts 75 acres for \$4170.<sup>37</sup> Susanna Roberts owned the George C. Davis House (HA-147,148) and a mill. According to John McGrain's molinography of Maryland Mills, George C. Davis, who was the father of Susannah Roberts, owned "a watermill worth \$2,000 with one employee and output of 600 bbl. meal and flour (\$4000). The 1858 Herrick Map showed G. Davis Mill on present Cool Branch Road (north side) (actually Glenville Road)

"The Mill was leased about 1876 by Miss Davis to a Mr. Parker, whose employed miller was H.K. Mitchell, Sr. The property later belonged to Dr. Roberts. The 1880 census showed Mrs. J. A. Roberts custom mill on Davis Run with \$3,000 investment, 1 employee, 3 run of stones, and 50 bu/diem maximum. A 21-foot fall drove a 14.5 hp, 15-inch turbine at 414 rpm. Output was 600 bbl flour, 18.5 tons meal, and 18.7 tons feed (\$8000)."

In 1914 Susannah Roberts sold both this house and the 208 acres and house she had inherited from George C. Davis.<sup>5</sup> In 1927 it was sold to Fred A. Vogel and incorporated into the almost 500-acre "Westwood" farm, which included most of the acreage on the northwest side Glenville Road until 1953. (See HA-147,148).

This bank house is of a traditional form common throughout the 19th century. Indeed, in form it is a scaled-down version of the nearby George C. Davis house. Unfortunately, however, this structure has undergone extensive re-modeling and without access to the interior, it is impossible to pin point its date of construction.

Stone masonry, 1½ stories high on a half-exposed basement, the north east corner of the house is deepest set into the hillside. The slate A-roof ridge line runs east-west, the house faces south, 3 bays x 2.

A chimney in the west end wall rises from no fire place.

Windows on the main floor are 6 lights on 6, in the attic end wall, 2 lights on 4, side wall single row of 3 lights.


