The Poplar House is one of a very few brick houses built in the Federal style remaining in Havre de Grace. It is a two and a half story, three bay, yellow stuccoed building, now in poor condition and used as an antique and junk store with apartments above. None of the original woodwork or trim remains on the first floor, even the fireplace and stairs having been removed. In building type it is closely related to the Elizabeth Rodgers House, an earlier building (c. 1788), which is less than a block away.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Poplar House is a two-and-a-half story, three bay Federal (c. 1835) townhouse of brick covered with yellow stucco. The building, in very poor condition, is used as a antique and junk store, with apartments above. Facing east on St. John St., the building is on a lot which is wider than it is deep, which perhaps accounts for the northwest slant of the north wall which gives to the structure the shape of a trapezoid. On the north side of the rear (west elevation) is a two story brick shed roof addition with a two story, three bay, porch under the overhanging shed of the roof on the south elevation.

It appears that the building was not originally faced with stucco because there is a bare, common bond wall of brick where the enclosed stairs join the building on the south wall. A high stone foundation is also evident on part of the south wall.

The first floor fenestration has been completely altered by the addition of a plate glass window and the enlargement of the door opening. On the second floor, facade, the windows have 6/6 light, double hung sash with wide, molded jambs and narrow, wooden sills; most of the windows on the wing are the same. The house has two dormer windows; the one on the front has an arched upper sash, pilasters and a segmental pediment while the one on the rear is similar with a triangular pediment. The flanks of the main block are blind with the exception of an attic window with 6/6 light double hung sash, in the south gable end.

The entrance in the north bay of the facade has been altered; presently it contains a glass paneled door with a large single light transom above it.

The main block has a gable flank roof covered with asphalt tiles and a large, multi-flue chimney rising from the north wall. A narrow, molded box cornice with a fascia board beneath it is present on the facade. An exterior, cinder block chimney is on the west wall of the shed addition.

None of the original wood work or trim remain on the first floor, even the fireplace and stairs have been removed.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Poplar House is one of a very few brick houses built in the Federal style remaining in Havre de Grace. In building type it is closely related to the Colonel John Rodgers House an earlier building (c. 1790), less than a block away from it. Both have a two-thirds Georgian plan.

George Bartol, a town commissioner for many years, bought the land from William B. Stokes in 1830. William Poplar bought the property from Bartol in 1835 and sold it four years after he received it for ice the price he paid for it. Therefore, it may be conjectured that the present house was built during the years of Poplar ownership (1835-1839), although it may have been built earlier.

This building with its pleasing size, scale and dormer detail could be a tremendous addition to the appearance of St. John St. and the Central Business District as a whole. It is through preservation of such buildings as the Poplar House - a block from the Susquehanna River - that we are reminded of Havre de Grace as a port with schooners and steamboats tied up at the town wharf just before the advent of the railroad and canal.


