DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Green's Pharmacy Building is a two story, two bay by six bay frame building (aprox. 15' x 40') with a two story, one bay wing on the east under a hipped roof. The main section is stucco over weather board while the wing is covered with asbestos shingles, painted white. The short side, facing west on the corner of N. Washington St. and Congress Ave. is the present front. The north elevation abutts a brick commercial building while the south elevation has a one story enclosed porch with a Barber Shop in it, across most of the first story. The front of the building is black tile and glass on the first story, and has a overhanging wooden shed across the second story with the pharmacy's name written on it.

The second story, south elevation has an unusual fenestration pattern. The end windows are spaced a few feet in from the wall and have a few feet between them and the four closely spaced center windows, which are themselves arranged in pairs. The windows contain 6/1 light sash, flanked by louvered shutters, the third and fifth bay having one shutter each. Windows on the wing are smaller and have 6/6 light sash with plain wide framing while the attic gable has a recessed 6/1 light sash window.

A glass door in the center bay gives entrance to the pharmacy. The wing has two doors on the south elevation. The glass and wood door in the west bay with a brick stoop in front of it is used as an entry.

The building has a hipped roof, covered with asphalt shingles. The shingles extend to the second story shed overhang on the second story of the front elevation. A small brick chimney straddles the ridge of the ~~roof~~ on the main block.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Green's Pharmacy is a long, low, two story, commercial building with apartments above. The recent enclosure of a second story porch with a veneer of vertical boards has altered the appearance of the building considerably. Only the building's basic outline, hipped roof and second story windows, south elevation give some idea of what it looked like at an earlier date.

The structure was probably built around 1870 when Thomas Sadler began a drug and paint store in it. The present owner's family took over operation of the store in 1916.


