## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Edmund Hoopes House is a two story stone house built ca. 1853 - 1855 which is located on the east side of Hoopes Road about 1/4 mile north of the intersection of Gibson Road in Harford County, Maryland. The site consists of a main house, oriented northwest toward Hoopes Road, a carriage house behind the main house, a frame bank barn north of the house, and several fieldstone walls apparently contemporary with the rest of the complex.

The main house has a three-bay main elevation on the northwest with a center entry and center hall plan. A one story shed porch with scroll-sawn brackets shelters the entry. Stone steps at the end of the porch replace the original wood flight which was located at the center of the porch. The porch now has a plain balustrade across its length. The fenestration is 6/6 with some storm windows in place. The main entrance has a four-light transom. The gable ends of the house have two bays with two small square attic-level windows in addition to 6/6 windows on both lower floors. A cellar bulkhead entrance projects from the north gable end. At the rear of the house is a flat roofed summer kitchen and washhouse now connected to the house by a lean-to addition. A shed entry porch over the rear entrance to the main house fills in the angle between house and summer kitchen. The interior end chimneys are brick and the gable roof is slate. A date stone reading "1853" or "1855" is located in the north gable end.

About 25 feet east of the house is the frame carriage house. The board and batten siding has been much altered by the addition of windows and transoms on the south elevation. The carriage stall is open and the tack and tool rooms have been changed to other uses over the years, most recently to accommodate a woodworking shop.

The frame barn is located about 75 yards north of the house. The base of the building is stone with an upper structure of vertical siding over frame. A concrete block extension is attached to a frame addition on the northwest corner. The upper structure and the extension apparently were rebuilt after a 1919 fire.

Several fieldstone walls are located near the main house and on the west side of Hoopes Road. These are apparently contemporary with the buildings on the farm. The walls on the west side of Hoopes Road are somewhat unusual for the large granite boulders on the top level of the wall.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Edmund Hoopes House is locally significant as the homestead of the Hoopes family, the owners and operators of a grist and saw mill which stood on the banks of St. Omer's Branch across Hoopes Road west of the house. The Hoopes family were also prominent in the development of Jersey cattle breeding stock, fruit orchards, and other agricultural endeavors.

## HISTORY AND SUPPORT:

The farm on which the Edmund Hoopes House stands was acquired by the Hoopes family through the marriage of Edmund Hoopes of Chester County, Pennsylvania to Phoebe Trimble, daughter of Joseph Trimble, who owned three farms in the St. Omer's Branch valley. The three were named Sunny-side (Trimble's main residence), Woodside, and the Michael Place. The three properties comprised a tract of about 500 acres. Trimble had acquired the land in 1825 by purchase from Daniel Clark. The original survey was Wheeler and Clark's Contrivance.

Edmund Hoopes' brothers Darlington and William married sisters of Phoebe Trimble Hoopes and through them acquired possession of the Sunnyside Farm (Darlington and Rachel Hoopes) and the Michael Place (William and Elizabeth Hoopes). Joseph Trimble continued to live at Sunnyside until his death at the age of 98 in 1870.

Edmund Hoopes built the stone house about 1853-1855. The datestone appears to read 1853, but the Hoopes genealogist Charles P. Polk says the stone reads "E & PTH 1855." Edmund and his brother Darlington built and operated a grist mill and saw mill on St. Omer's Branch. A sorghum mill also operated in the saw mill building.

Edmund Hoopes died in 1863 and his widow sold Woodside to her nephew, Joseph Trimble Hoopes, Darlington's son, in 1875. Joseph Hoopes and his family with his parents occupied Woodside after 1875. During this period, Darlington Hoopes achieved prominence as the "minister" of Little Falls Friends Meeting. Walter Preston, in his History of Harford County (1901), said of Darlington Hoopes, ". . . (his) plain, simple and earnest pleading of the cause of truth as he saw it, coupled with an unspotted life, still keeps his memory green among those who came within his influence."

STORY AND SUPPORT - Continued

In 1891, Joseph Hoopes bought St. Omer's Farm (HA-965) from his brother David and farmed it as well as Woodside. Darlington Hoopes had already given Sunnyside to their sister, Anna T. Hoopes. Joseph Hoopes was one of the earliest Jersey cattle breeders in the country, having bought his first Jersey in 1880. In time, his herd at Woodside became one of the largest in the county and won many agricultural prizes. Charles Polk states Hoopes built the first silos in the state when there were only three in the entire country. He also operated a dairy from Woodside. The barn at Woodside burned in 1919, destroying the dairy, its machinery, and wiping out the dairy herd and several horses. Joseph moved to Chestertown, leaving the farm in the charge of his son Wilmer. In 1923, Wilmer Hoopes bought Woodside from his father's estate, retaining possession until his retirement in 1951.

Addendum: J. T. Hoopes' silo may not have been the first in Maryland. "In 1887 Henry Alvord noted that (Francis) Morris (of Maryland) was the first person in the United States to build silos (ca. 1876-77) and make ensilage for cattle food, implying that Morris inaugurated the practice among farmers as distinct from research scientists."--Allen G. Noble, "The Diffusion of Silos," Landscape (1981), Vol. 25, No. 1, p.11-12.




