The Esworthy House faces north on the south side of Route 144, just east of the Exxon Service Station. (01+90-1898)

It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high gabled roof (running east-west) century old log (covered with aluminum siding) house with central rectangular cross paneled entrance and wide brick chimney in set into its west wall. A two story high shed roofed kitchen wing on its south wall follows the pitch of the gable roof of the log house, creating a New England Salt Box effect.

Owned by Mrs. Hazel Esworthy, it was once the home of T. Peddicord and later of John Bond, according to Mrs. Celia Holland, local historian.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Esworthy House faces north on the south side of Route 144, 300 feet east of its intersection with Madison. It is a three bay wide, one room deep, two story high, gabled roof (running east-west) log house (covered with green asbestustile) resting on a stone foundation and holding a wide brick chimney in its west wall.

The north elevation holds a central rectangular cross paneled entrance door, covered by a shed roofed portico, supported by two square wooden posts. It is flanked by single double-hung windows, holding one-over-one lights and vertically aligned to two similar second floor windows. The west wall of the log house holds a four-over-four light second floor window. The east wall holds a six-over-six light second floor window and a square attic vent.

A very early shed roofed addition continues the pitch of the gable roof, constructed off the building's south wall and results in a New England Satt Box. A tall, square brick chimney rises from its west side.

The west wall of this addition holds a first and second floor six-over-six window, and its north wall holds two six light casement second floor windows. To this north wall has been added a one story high, shed roofed, enclosed porch which holds on the west side of its north wall a continuous line of four nine light windows, with a four light, rectangular north entrance door to the east, flanked to the east by a nine light window and to the west by a six light window which connects to the continuous windows.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Esworthy Log House is significant architecturally and historically.

Architecturally it is one of the six log houses in Lisbon, constructed in the early decades of the nineteenth century. The others are the M.E. Parsonage, HO-198; the Buckingham House, HO-247; the Misses Warfield House, HO-233; the Joggereit House, HO-231 and HO-203, the Picket Log House, which in 1973 was dismantled and moved to Pennsylvania. HO-201, the Mathis House and HO-202, the Mayne Log-Brick House, both of which have two story log kitchen north wings with enclosed staircases may also be added to this list.

The Esworthy House is particularly noteworthy for it remains much as it was when first constructed. This is also true of the M.E. Parsonage and the Joggereit House. Both the Buckingham House and the Misses Warfield House (moved South from its original site) have been widened with additions along its east and south walls. The Parsonage, Esworthy and Joggereit Houses, however, appear on their north facades very much as they did when first constructed. All, however, have been covered with frame or aluminum siding and all have south two story high kitchen wings. That of the Esworthy House is noteworthy for its addition is unique and reminiscent of a New England Salt Boy, a two story high shed roofed addition which follows the pitch of the log house's gable roof. The small second floor windows on its south elevation are particularly noteworthy.

In addition to its individual architectural significance, the Esworthy House is important to the streetscape on the south side of Route 144, providing an anchor east of the Exxon Service Station, for the Joggereit and Ridgely Mercier Homes.

Historically the Esworthy House, according to Celia Holland, local historian, was the home of T. Peddicord and later John Bond. Both the 1878 Hopkins Atlas and the 1860 Martennot Map delineate the house clearly.

According to Celia Holland, local historian the building was first built circa 1830 - 1840. It is presently owned by Mrs. Hazel Esworthy who maintains this house and grounds beautifully, enhancing the charm of this century old dwelling with her care and attention.

Architecturally and historically noteworthy, the Esworthy House should be placed on the National Register of Historic Places with the entire town of Lisbon.







 Martenet's Map of Lisbon 1860




