7.1 Description, continued

This brick two-story house faces south, 5 bays by 2, two stories high on stone foundations. The five 2nd floor windows and two sets of two windows flanking the center door all have 6/6 sash. Center-hall in plan, it has an ell extending north along the west end wall, 1 story high.

The roof has moderately wide eaves and no trim. Two chimneys rise inside the gable end walls from fireplaces on each floor. The only windows on the gable ends are in the attic, and are two small square windows flanking the chimney, with 3/3 sash each.

A peaked-roof (gable) portico or small front porch shelters the front door, with thin paired Tuscan columns on each side, and a plain four-bar railing (balustrade).

There is a square stone smokehouse, with hip roof, near the house, probably one of several outbuildings.


