Edgewood Farm faces east on the north side of Route 108, just west of the Howard County Vocational School. It is a five bay wide, one roof deep, two and a half story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure with central intersecting gable holding a roman arched window, and a square brick chimney inset into its north wall. It is typical late nineteenth century "vernacular style" with a west wing addition located off the south side of its west wall.

Fenestration for the house is rectangular, double hung, holding two-over-two lights, vertically aligned and proportionally scaled.

Edgewood Farms is noteworthy historically through its association with the Dorsey-Clark-Gaither families of Howard County.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Edgewood Farm faces east on the north side of Route 108, just west of the Howard County Vocational School. It is a five bay wide, one room deep, two and a half story high, gabled roof (running north-south) frame structure with central intersecting gable holding a roman window, and a square brick chimney inset into its north wall. It is typical late nineteenth century "vernacular" style with a west wing addition located off the south side of its west wall.

Fenestration for the house is rectangular, double hung, holding two-over-two lights, vertically aligned and proportionally scaled. In addition, a central roman arched, double-hung window, holding two-over-two lights is placed on the east facade of the intersecting gable, while two four light, rectangular casement attic windows are located on the north and south elevations.

An excellent stone barn lies south of the house, as well as a Dorsey-Clark cemetery of the nineteenth century.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Edgewood Farm is significant historically and architecturally.

Historically, the farm goes back to the early nineteenth century when Elizabeth Freshour conveyed the farm in trust to William Gibbons on the 18 May, 1833 (18-47 A.A. County). Architecturally, the building is representative of the five bay wide, central hall, late nineteenth century "vernacular" style architecture of Howard County. This two and a half story high, frame farm house features a central intersecting gable and L plan seen throughout Howard County in the mid to late nineteenth century. Usually a two story high kitchen wing formed the L for this type of house.

Historically the farm comprised 253 acres of land and was known as "Owen Dorsey's Farm," conveyed to him by his brother, Michael Dorsey.

On February 1, 1877, James MacKubin, acting as trustee for the property (willed to William H. Freshour by Elizabeth Freshour on March 3, 1857), conveyed the farm to Elizabeth Colladay, after a public auction on the steps of the Court House in Ellicott City. (H.C. Land Records, Liber 37, folio 412). Some two years later the farm was acquired by Christopher Davis (LJW 40-465).

Later owned by the Clark and Gaither families, it is now the property of Mr. Phillip Dorsch and his wife, Katherine Gaither Dorsch, daughter of the previous owners, Mr. and Mrs. W. Clark Gaither.

Historically noteworthy for its association with the Dorsey-Clark-Gaither families of Howard County and architecturally significant as a fine example of "vernacular" style architecture, Edgewood Farm should be considered for inclusion to the National Register of Historic Places and the State Critical Areas Program.

Such a step would help insure its continued preservation and the integrity of its present site, located on the northeast corner of Route 108 and Homewood Road. Its excellent stone barn should also be included on any such recommendation.


