The chimneys are ^{extremely} inward sloping because they copy those of <u>Conroy's Birth</u> closely, with ^{interior} interior sloping ^{outer walls above the roof line} upward. There is also a new one story wing used as a laundry room + porch. This house is a late carry-over of an early style. It is three bays long on its east facade, two on the west facade with central door. The brick on the west side is laid in common bond and has flat brick arches above the windows which have 2/2 sashes. On the north gable is a two bay two story brick wing which used to be one-and-one-half stories, indicated by the brick work in the gable. The chimneys are noteworthy because they copy those of *Comeqys Bight* close by, with inward sloping outer walls above the roof line. There is also a new one-story wing used as a laundry room and porch. It has a fine view across the Chester River to Queen Anne's County.
