Based on the available information, the Marion Coleman House, located at 21542 Sharp Street in Rock Hall, Maryland, does not appear to meet the Criteria for listing in the Maryland Register of Historic Properties. The house is located outside of the Maryland Register Eligible Rock Hall Historic District in an area of modern construction. The L-plan, gable roofed frame house, which was constructed c. 1880 with later additions and alterations, does not appear to have any architectural significance. Moreover, it has undergone substantial alterations, including the stuccoing of the exterior in 1927 and the addition of an enclosed front porch in recent decades, which have resulted in a significant loss of integrity. The property is not known to be associated with any significant event or person.

Description

This ell-shaped frame structure is located northeast of Rock Hall close to the junction of MD 20 and MD 674. Assuming its present size and shape by accretion, its core is the simple, rectangular two-story structure which constitutes the front section. It was built by Marion Coleman for his bride Ella, during the first few years following their wedding in 1880. The gable roof parallels the plane of the southeast, or principal facade, which is evenly divided into three bays. Corbelled brick chimneys are located inside each of the end walls. The cornices are boxed and have returns on the gable end. The entrance to the structure is obscured by a fairly recently constructed porch, with jalousied windows above low brick walls.

The fenestration is regular, with six-over-six lights along the principal elevation, one at each level in the end walls offset to the southeast, and two exposed on the rear, or northwest elevation, in the southeast bay. The interior plan is a simple two-over-two design with a centered stairway.

The house was expanded to the rear by the turn of the century with the construction of the large, three bay long, two-story ell, offset to the northeast on the rear of the main block. The windows are mostly four-over-four lights, with a one-over-one light just to the north of the secondary entrance on the northeast elevation of the ell. On the southwest elevation the fenestration is more regular, with three windows on the second story aligned over those at the first level, and another doorway in the southeast bay near the junction of the principal block and the ell. A corbelled brick chimney is located inside of the blank end wall, or northwest elevation.


The entire structure was stuccoed in 1927. None of the original outbuildings are extant.

Statement of Significance

This large, ell-shaped dwelling, unoccupied for at least twenty years, was constructed by Marion Coleman for his bride around 1885, and expanded shortly thereafter to house a rapidly expanding family. The Colemans were a family of masons. The structure, very typical for the Eastern Shore, is unremarkable, and has lost integrity because of the stuccoing of its exterior walls, as well as the enclosure of the front porch and loss of period outbuildings.
