602 High Street is a twostory frame house which is three bays long and one room deep. The door is on the east side of the facade and it has a small rectangular transom. The building is covered with beaded clapboard and has an exposed fireplace back. The windows have 2/2 sash and in the attic there are two 4 pane casement windows. To the rear of the dwelling is a two story addition. This house is the same as its neighbor, 600 High Street and shares the same roof pitch on both the front and rear sections.


