Based on the available information, the house at 22652 McKinleyville Road in the Piney Neck-Skinners Neck vicinity of Kent County does not meet any of the National Register Criteria for listing. The frame, two story, gable roofed house with rear ell may date to the 19th or early 20th centuries. However, it retains little sense of its original architectural character, due to numerous alterations, including additions and artificial sidings and trim. Therefore, it does not appear to merit inclusion in the Register under Criterion C for architectural significance. As a consequence of its diminished integrity, it may lack the ability to convey significance under any of the other Criteria. Moreover, it has no known association with significant events or people and thus is unlikely to be eligible under Criteria A or B. It is not located in any known historic district.


