Description

The large house consists of four stone sections and one frame section. The principal part is a sandstone, two-story block 3 bays wide with a gable roof and double chimneys in the east end. The center section is a one and a half story, two bay, frame section with a gable roof and a one-story Victorian porch. Two, one-story stone sections are attached to the frame section. The kitchen is on a lower level than the main block and contains a large cooking fireplace. There is a loft room above it. Four sections are laid up in rough uncoursed stone with large quoining blocks. Near the house is a one and a half story slave quarter built of stone in 1833.

10. Significance

Three families important in Montgomery County history, each among the earliest settlers of Maryland, the Veatches, the Trundles, and the Gotts, occupied this house. During the Civil War four sons-in-laws of the household served with Confederate forces. Stonewall Jackson and his staff visited here September 6, 1862. A mini-ball is embedded in one wall, a relic of skirmishes fought in and around the grounds.

An important mill was located on the Little Monocacy River just below the house, operated by the Veatches and later, the Gotts.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (If known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house is built in five sections, four of stone and one of frame. The eastern stone block is the main block; it is 2 stories with a three bay south facade and double chimneys (for heating stoves) at the east end. The entrance is through the west bay; a hall partition wall has been removed to make one large room on the main floor. On the second floor there are two rooms off the hall.

The center section is frame, 1-1/2 stories, with a Victorian porch across the south facade. It has a fireplace at the west end. A small boxed staircase in the northeast corner rises to the loft space.

To the west of the frame section are two smaller dependencies which were once service rooms.

The north wing is the kitchen; like the main block, it is stone. It has a large internal chimney at the north end and two bay east and west walls. The loft space over the kitchen has two dormer windows on each roof slope; the dormers had been removed and the present ones are replacements. In this section the original roof framing of lapped and pegged rafters and collars is visible.

The stone sections are laid up in rough, uncoursed stone with large cut quoining blocks. The main block has a framed, boxed cornice, while the kitchen wing has three courses of successively projecting brick.

A double slave quarters behind the house has been restored. It has flush gable end chimneys and corner boxed staircases leading to the loft space.

OTHER: When the house was purchased by the Millers, it was only a shell that they have reconstructed. The walls and some of the roof framing are original but the window frames, dormers, paneling and hardware are new.

The main section is dated 1833; the kitchen and/or frame sections may predate this according to the builder who renovated and reconstructed the house.
