DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a seven-arch span, of dressed stone, that carried the waters of the C & O Canal over the Monocacy River. The stone is white quartzite or "mountain sandstone", from the base of nearby Sugarloaf Mountain. Each of the arches is held by a keystone and the walls are topped by a continuous flat stone parapet. Much of the iron railing was damaged by the "Agnes" storm in recent years (1972) but the sections have been retrieved and are kept nearby.
