DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

According to Florence Hallman, community informant for Big Woods, this house was a frame dwelling with two rooms down and two up. They were heated by wood burning stoves and had double hung sash windows with 6 x 6 panes. It resembled the homes of the Gene Hackett and Henry T. Onley, which remain standing and which have been photographed as part of this survey. See descriptions of those sites for more details.

Mrs. Hallman recalls that there was a one room log kitchen attached to the rear of this house. Behind it was a meat house, and other out-buildings common to small farmsteads.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house stood on land that was purchased by Adolph Higgins in 1872, soon after the Civil War and emancipation (deed EBP 10/405). It was purchased from James and Annie Trundle and consisted of 7 1/8 acres. The land cost \$142.50. It was a part of the tract known as "It May Be In Good Time". The Trundles owned a considerable amount of property in Big Woods and were one of the white families that sold lots to incoming Blacks after emancipation. Though Higgins did own land here in 1872, neither he nor any of the other Black landowners of Big Woods who were there at the time (except Rev. Elijah Awkard) were shown on the map of Medley's district in Hopkins' Atlas of 1879 of Montgomery County.

The other Black landowners of the 1870s in Big Woods built log houses, and it is unusual that Higgins' house was frame. Probably it was a replacement for an earlier log dwelling. Perhaps the kitchen attached to the back length was a part of the original house.
