William and Georgia Hackey House

This two story frame house, with a three bay facade, was built by its owner, William Hackey, a Black carpenter in Clarksburg. In plan, it contained two rooms down and two up. It is another example of the homes of black families that were built by their owners. In the 19th century this practice had been common place, but in the 20th it has diminished.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story frame house stands on the east side of Clarksburg Road. The facade is oriented towards the road. The house is somewhat smaller than the Arthur Gibson house, which is also located on Clarksburg Road. The plan however is pretty much the same. There were two rooms downstairs and two rooms upstairs. The facade contains three bays like the Gibson house; the door was centrally located, flanked by two windows on either side. The house is one bay in depth. To the back of the house has been added a one and a half story kitchen with bath above in more recent years. Several other changes of the house have also been made. For example, the weatherboards on the outside have been replaced by asbestos shingles, the tin roof has been recovered with composition roofing material and the old foundation has been replaced. The front porch was originally similar to the shed porch with turned posts and brackets on the Thomas Snowden house on nearby Piedmont Road. According to Mrs. Flordie Ziegler, she and her husband made substantial improvements to the interior of the house after they purchased it in 1943 (Deed 922/170).

None of the outbuildings of this house remain. The only storage place still in use is the cellar which has a door going down into it on the north side of the house. This entrance was added by the Zieglers.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to 284/409, this tract of 1.00 acre was purchased by William Hackey and his wife Georgia from Robert Randolph in 1919. According to oral informants in Clarksburg, Ethel Foreman, Arthur Randolph, and Flordie Ziegler, this house was built by William L. Hackey after he purchased the land. Thus this house shows that some of the houses of Black families in the county were built by the owners themselves.

This family is another example of the extended family network that has been found in many communities in the county. William L. Hackey's sister married Arthur Gibson, another Black carpenter in Clarksburg and whose house has been surveyed. His other sister married Robert Randolph, from whom William Hackey purchased this land. Their descendants continue to live in the area.

As part of this survey, the family photograph of William Hackey during his youth was copied.


