The Etchison-Snyder house is a circa. 1875 rural vernacular frame and log dwelling. The house was built in three sections; the main block being comprised of the two older parts with a later rear addition. The original section of the house is to the south west and consisted of a two story, two bay by one bay dwelling with a large end chimney. This may of may not have been the early dwelling of Elijah Etchison who appears here on the 1865 map of the county. Not long after, an addition much like in original house, architectually, was added. The rear wing and porch, with its early twentieth century looking rounded columns, were added in the early 1900's. The house appears to be in good, original condition. It is architectural-ly a simply designed, unornamented structure. It typifies the home of a mid to late nineteenth century farmer of limited means. The house appears to have grown with the farmer and his family as he became more prosperous.

The house was probably built about 1875 by Luther W. and Eugenia Snyder. The Snyders purchased the 200 acre farm on which their house was constructed from the heirs of Henry Griffith in June of 1874.¹ After Luther's death Eugenia conveyed the farm the Goerge and Ella Snyder in November of 1894.² The kept it only two years before selling it to James Ayton.³ James died in 1910 leaving a wife, Frances and their children, Elizabeth and George. A few years later the farm was sold by trustee. The improvements to the 190 3/4 acre farm at this time consisted of an eight to ten room dwelling, a stable, granary and other outbuildings.⁴ The farm was sold to Charles T. Hawkins in August of 1914 and remained in the family for many years.⁵ Finally, in January of 1966 it was sold to an E. Brooke Lee organization. Lee rented the huse for many years but it now stands vacant.

Included on the property now is a barn in poor condition.



On April 30, 1987, the Montgomery County Planning Board held a public hearing, as required under the Moratorium on Alteration and Demolition, Section 24A-10 of the County's Historic Preservation Ordinance, to make a finding on the significance of the Etchison-Snyder Farmhouse, identified as Site #14/10 in the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Sites in Montgomery County, Maryland.

This site, located at 7200 Damascus Road (Rte. 108) was found not to warrant designation on the master plan. At the conclusion of the hearing, the Planning Board closed the record on the site and voted unanimously to remove this property from the Locational Atlas in order to allow the issuance of a demolition permit on the site.

Although removed from the Locational Atlas, the site will remain on the Maryland Historical Trust's Inventory.




