Also on the property is an interesting collection of farm buildings, including a barn, hen house and smoke house.

The Rezin Duvall farmhouse is a rural vernacular dwelling which includes the incorporation of an earlier log residence into the building of the later, circa. 1900 frame house. This rather ordinarily designed house is one of a number of houses in the area built by a Duvall, one of the first families to settle in the Damascus area. For many years most of the farms in this general area were owned by members of the Duvall family.¹ The house is typical of both the other Duvall residences (except that it included the earlier log house) and of the more basic dwellings of late nineteenth, early twentieth century Montgomery County. Still in the Duvall family, the exterior of the house has not been changed since the early 1900's.²

The early log section of the house was built by Rezin Duvall sometime between 1867 and 1872.³ Rezin built his house on 95 1/4 acres of the "Richardson's Range" tract which he purchased for \$571.50 from the heirs of Lewis Duvall in June of 1867.⁴ Rezin originally ran a tobacco farm here. It later became a dairy farm.⁵

Rezin died in October of 1885 leaving the farm to his wife, Mary P. and daughter, Susan L. Duvall. Susan died about a month later. Due to an excess of debts, it was decided that the farm be sold by a court appointed trustee. The farm of 53 acres, well wooded and watered, was in 1887 improved by a two story, six room log dwelling recently weatherboarded, a dairy, stable, meat house and other necessary farm buildings.⁶ The farm was sold in November of 1887 to Susan's half sister and her husband, Mary and Thomas Penn, for \$752.⁷

The Penns sold the farm to William and Harriet Duvall in August of 1893.⁸ The Duvalls built on the frame section which is now the main block of the house about 1900.⁹ In May of 1918 the farm was purchased by Sherwood and Verdie Duvall for \$2,000.¹⁰

The farm is now the property of the son of Sherwood and Verdie Duvall, Kenneth Duvall. It was described after Verdie's death in 1969 as 52.516 acres improved by an older two story frame structure.

Downstairs included an entry hall, two living rooms, both with fireplaces and a kitchen. Upstairs were four bedrooms and a bath. The house had both a front and back porch. Also on the property was listed a dairy barn, smoke house, hen house, corn crib and an implement shed.¹¹ It is still a working farm, producing beef cattle, hay and some truck crops.¹²





