

The Poole House is a small, four-bay, side-gabled frame house covered with pebble-dash stucco. A central chimney is located on the ridge line of the seamed-metal roof. Windows are six/six and shuttered on the second story and one/one on the ground floor and unshuttered, with plain surrounds. Gable ends have small centered windows and return cornices.

The main facade (south) has a full-width shed-roofed porch supported by turned posts. The structure's most interesting feature is its double entranceway on the main facade, twin paneled doors which (in the westernmost) bay lead to a room now used as a bedroom and (in the easternmost bay) to the living room. A stairway at the rear of the living room ascends to two rooms on the second floor.

The structure has been enlarged by several twentieth century additions, including a small one-story shed-roof enclosed porch at the southeast facade and a large shed-roof, vertically-sided kitchen at the northwest corner of the main block; a deck has been added at the rear of the kitchen. Adjacent to the kitchen, at the northeast corner of the main block, is a gable-roof, stuccoed wing which formerly served as the kitchen and has now been converted to a second living room; a carport is attached at the rear. This earlier kitchen may be a late nineteenth century addition.

Although the rear kitchen addition is large and not architecturally compatible, it is reversible and not visible from the front of the house. The main block, which is the oldest section of the house, has basically retained its original configuration.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The William Poole House is historically significant because of its long association with one of the early families in the area, the Pooles, and architecturally significant as an example of a simple I-form, late nineteenth century farmhouse of the type which is rapidly disappearing from rural areas. It is also an established and familiar visual feature in the neighborhood.

The existing two-story house was probably erected in the late 1880s by William H. Poole, who is listed in the tax records for 1887 as the owner of 14 acres of a tract known as "Cow Pasture" on which there were "improvements" valued at \$450. Poole may have erected a smaller structure on the site as early as 1876, since the tax records for that year show improvements valued at \$50; a second listing for 1876 indicates an increase in the value of improvements to \$150.<sup>(1)</sup> William H. Poole is shown as a property owner on the Hopkins Atlas for 1878.<sup>(3)</sup>

The structure is located on approximately 100 acres of Cow Pasture which Hannah E. Poole, William Poole's wife, acquired in 1860 from Allen Miles, her father; the deed conveying the property to Hannah Poole described it as "all that parcel on which William H. Poole now lives".<sup>(2)</sup>

In 1898, Hannah and William Poole conveyed approximately 18 acres of Cow Pasture and the farmhouse to Rufus K. Day, who, in 1902, in turn conveyed it to his sons, James and Langdon Day. In the period between 1912, when the Days sold the property, and 1987, when it was acquired by the present owners, the Robertsons, the property changed hands approximately every 10 years, with the acreage conveyed decreasing from 18 to two (by 1912) and then to its present 0.8 acre (by 1963).<sup>(4)</sup>

Little is known about William H. Poole except that he is identified as a farmer in Boyd's description of Cedar Grove in the 1870s.<sup>(5)</sup>

Schedule A

All that piece or parcel of land situate, lying and being in Montgomery County, Maryland, being part of a tract called, "Cow Pasture", described as follows:

BEGINNING for the same at an iron pipe, being at the beginning of a conveyance from Marion W. MacNab, Widow, to James W. Layton, et ux by deed dated March 9, 1962 and recorded in Liber 2947 at folio 1, among the Land Records of said County. Said pipe being at the intersection of the third line of a conveyance from Mary E. Riggs, et vir to Frances J. McDonald, et vir by deed dated February 12, 1912 and recorded in Liber 226 at Folio 210 among said Land Records with a southerly right of way line of the Damascus-Cedar Grove Road, Maryland Route 27, as the same is shown on Plat filed in Plat Book 3 at plat 10923 of the Maryland State Roads Commission in the Clerks office of said County. And running thence with part of the said third line and with part of the last line of Laytons lot reversed, South 41 degrees 29' East 167.47 feet; thence to include a part of Liber 226, at folio 210 the lands therein having been later conveyed to Harry F. Appleby, Widower to Ronald C. MacNab and Marion W. MacNab, his wife by deed dated August 28, 1942 and recorded in Liber 888 at folio 161; thence South 39 degrees 37' 30" West 178.98 feet to a point on the easterly side of the Kings Valley Road; thence bounding thereon North 30 degrees 04' 49" West 58.69 feet, thence with the line of dedication as shown on the aforesaid State Roads Commission Plat North 39 degrees, 55' 11" East 5.00 feet; thence North 50 degrees 04' 49" West 125.00 feet; thence North 06 degrees 53' 40" East 55.06 feet on the southeasterly side of the aforesaid Damascus-Cedar Grove Road; thence bounding on North 55 degrees 55' 20" East 96.00 feet thence North 58 degrees 53' East 58.08 feet; thence North 58 degrees 03' 40" East 5.95 feet to the place of beginning and containing 0.838 of an Acre, more or less ACCORDING to a survey by William Neal Hurley, Jr., June 1963.

Being part of the land conveyed to Ronald C. MacNab and Marion W. MacNab, his wife by Harry F. Appleby by deed dated August 28, 1942 and recorded among said Land Records in Liber 888 at folio 161.

Legend:




Historic Parcel




