9. Description: This simple three bay by one bay, two-and-a-half-story flemish and common bonded brick house faces south. The south porch has a half-hipped roof supported by four turned posts and enclosed by a simple wooden railing. There are six-over-six double-hung windows throughout the house. The gable roof is covered by raised seam metal roofing. There is a one-story lean-to addition with a shed roof on the north elevation.

10. Significance: This solidly-built brick house was constructed in the late 18th century, and appears to have been used as a tenant house for most of its lifetime.

Part of the tract "Resurvey on Benjamin's Square", this property with improvements was sold by Lodowick and Forest Davis to Jeremiah Davis in the 1790s. Jeremiah sold the house with $4\frac{1}{4}$ acres of land to Evan Belt in 1797 and 20 years later Belt heirs sold it to Benjamin Lyon. Lyon did not live in the house himself, but had as his tenant through the mid-19th century, Miss Eliza Wilcoxon. The property was sold to Charles T. Hogan in 1877. Hogan was a blacksmith who may have lived in the house.

Ledoux Elgee Riggs bought it in 1896. He and his wife Anna sold 180 acres including the house in 1907 to Charles and Rachel Beall. The Bealls lived there five years before selling it to William H. Fulks. Fulks rented the house to tenants for many years, and after his death in 1959 his heirs sold 289 acres to the present owner. Land from this large parcel is gradually being sold off, and the brick house is also waiting disposition.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This three bay by one bay, two-and-a-half story brick house faces south.

Built on fieldstone foundation, the house has Flemish-bonded brick on the south elevation and common bonded brick on the east and west elevation. The walls are 14"-15" thick. There is a two story lean-to addition on the north elevation; it is frame and covered by red brick asbestos siding, and has a cinderblock foundation. There is a porch on the south elevation with a half hipped roof supported by four turned posts and enclosed by a simple wooden railing. The south (front) door is wooden paneled. On the west elevation there is an enclosed entry with a shed roof. The west door is wooden paneled.

The house has six-over-six double-hung windows. There are two gabled six-over-three double-hung dormer windows on the south elevation.

The gable roof is covered by raised seam metal roofing. There are east and west interior gable end brick chimneys. The north lean-to addition has an exterior stove chimney.

Inside, there are two rooms each floor of the main (original) house. The fireplaces in the first and second floor rooms (one in each room) have been closed, and those in the first floor rooms are flanked by built-in small wooden cupboards. The rear addition contains a large kitchen beneath a large bedroom.

SPECIFIC DATES late 18th century BUILDER/ARCHITECT

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This solidly-built brick house was constructed in the late 18th century, and appears to have been used as a tenant house for most of its lifetime.

The property is part of the tract "Resurvey on Benjamin's Square", and in the late 18th century was owned by the Davis family. Lodowick Davis, who helped organize the Goshen Methodist Episcopal Church, and Forest Davis each sold their shares in 42 acres of land, with improvements, to Jeremiah Davis in the 1790s.¹ Jeremiah in turn sold the house with only 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres of land to Evan Belt in 1797 for 184 pounds current money.² Evan Belt sold the property two years later to John Belt for the same amount,³ and in 1817 Belt's heirs sold it to Benjamin Lyon for only 100 pounds.⁴

Lyon did not live in the house himself, but had as his tenant through the mid-19th century Miss Eliza Wilcoxon, to whom he left a life estate and tenancy at his death.⁵ The property then went to his heirs, who sold it in 1877 to Charles T. Hogan.⁶ Hogan was a blacksmith and may have lived in the house, for his name appears on the 1878 Atlas. By that time an additional 3 $\frac{5}{8}$ ths acres had been added to the original 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres.

When the property came on the market in 1896 as a result of a default in a mortgage, Remus D. Riggs, a local farmer to whom the mortgage had been assigned, sold it to his son Ledoux Elgee Riggs.⁷ In the Montgomery Advocate advertisement for the "Assignee's Sale of Mortgaged Property", it is described as being:

located near the village of Goshen,....It is improved by a three story brick DWELLING HOUSE containing nine rooms; stable, ice house, corn crib and all necessary outbuildings. It has also on it a never failing spring of excellent water, and a fine young apple orchard.⁸

The elder Riggs owned a great deal of land in the Goshen area, and gradually conveyed it to his son Ledoux and daughter Mary R. Pumphrey;⁹ thus, the 4 $\frac{1}{4}$ acres on which the brick tenant house was located was incorporated into the larger holdings of Ledoux Elgee Riggs.

L.E. Riggs and his wife Anna sold 180 acres of this land, including the house, in 1907 to Charles and Rachel Beall,¹⁰ who lived on the land for five years before selling it to William H. Fulks.¹¹ Fulks rented the house to tenants for many years, and after his death in 1959 his heirs sold 289.2692 acres with the house to the present owner. Land from this large parcel is gradually being sold off, and the brick house is also awaiting disposition.



SUBJECT: Approved and Adopted May 1983 Amendment to the Master Plan for Historic Preservation

I am pleased to transmit to you the May 1983, Approved and Adopted Amendment to the Master Plan for Historic Preservation.

This amendment designates fourteen historic resources for preservation and protection under the County's Historic Preservation Ordinance, Chapter 24A of the Montgomery County Code. In addition, it identifies 83 sites that have been reviewed and found not suitable for regulation under the Ordinance. Those properties listed on the Locational Atlas and Index of Historic Resources in Montgomery County, Maryland are also exempted from any further regulation under the Moratorium on Alteration and Demolition, Section 24A-10 of the Preservation Ordinance.

Enclosure

- Associated with the Pearre family, early agriculturalists and prominent citizens of upper Montgomery County.
 - Because the acreage associated with this site is protected under a conservation easement, the site is designated with an environmental setting of approximately 6.7 acres to include the main house, the log dairy, the corn crib, and bank barn as features representative of the historic farmstead.
- 14/41 Goshen Mennonite Church (p. 10)
- 1870 -- Unique brick structure, based on a design by Washington architect, Walter West, and built by master builder S. G. Henseley.
 - Site of one of the oldest Methodist Episcopal Churches in Montgomery County.
 - The parcel includes, in addition to the church building, a cemetery and semi-circular tree-shaded drive with wrought iron entrance gates, all of which contribute to the churchyard setting. The entire parcel should, therefore, be retained as the environmental setting.
- 14/59 Fertile Meadows (p. 10)
- Fine example of a late 18th century County farmhouse with a "distinctive southern Maryland flavor."
 - Associated for nearly a century with the Riggs family, prominent businessmen and farmers in Montgomery County.
 - An appropriate setting should include the main house, the log meat house and corn crib, plus sufficient land to protect the complex from future development.
- 14/60 Riggs/Wilcoxon House (p. 10)
- Late 18th century, simple Federal style farmhouse with Flemish bond brickwork.
 - Example of typical tenant farmhouse once found throughout the County.
- 15/65 Waters Gift (p. 11)
- Mid-18th century altered log farmhouse.
 - Associated with the Waters family, early settlers of the northeastern part of the County.
- 22/17 Flint Hill II (p. 12)
- Early 19th century log and frame farmhouse.
 - Associated with the Bowie family, a prominent family in Montgomery County and Maryland history.




