The William Moore House is a heavily renovated two-story, center hall I-house located on an approximately two-acre site just off Ednor Road. The original section of the building was a two-story log and frame structure constructed about 1853 that is now a rear ell. Around 1908 a two-story, five bay frame I-house was built to the north of the ell which became the building's main core. In the 1940s the building was remodeled in the Colonial Revival style. In 1993-1994 the house again underwent renovation including a substantial two-bay extension of the principal facade. The Moore farmhouse no longer conveys its architectural or historical significance as a vernacular farmhouse. The building neither represents a distinctive type, period and method of historic design or construction nor does it convey its historical associations with the Moore family and their role in the settlement of the area.

The William Moore House is a heavily renovated two-story, center hall I-house located on an approximately two-acre site just off Ednor Road. The original section of the building was a two-story log and frame structure constructed about 1853 that is now a rear ell. Around 1908 a two-story, five bay frame I-house was built to the north of the ell which became the building's main core. The house's heating, plumbing and electrical system were modernized in 1935 and in the 1940s the building was remodeled in the Colonial Revival style. In 1993-1994 the house again underwent renovation including a substantial two-bay extension of the principal facade.

The Moore house in its present condition has an L-shaped ground plan with a wide seven bay two-story main side-gabled block and a two-story ell. A one-story shed roofed addition has been attached on the west and a one-story hipped roof addition has been attached to the south of the ell. The ell has a large exterior end chimney with a randomly laid stone base and a brick stack. The house had clapboard walls (now covered with vinyl siding) and has a standing seam metal roof on the main core and composition shingle covers the roof of the ell.

A pedimented entry porch supported by paired full length square columns dominates the principal facade on the north. A pentagonal window is centered in the pediment and the cornice has dentils and boxed eaves. The house has a pedimented entry frontispiece and raised window surrounds. These replacement windows on the main facade have cornice heads with six-over-six sash and are symmetrically arranged in long ranks on the seven bay first and second levels.

The west facade has a rank of four six-over-six windows at the first level and on the second floor has paired six-over-six windows surmounted by transoms that elongate the windows and break the overall fenestration pattern. To the rear of the south elevation, a large wooden patio has been built within the L. Double French doors lead out to the patio from the south facade of the main block and the east wall of the ell. A tripartite rank of six-over-six windows is located on both levels of the rear elevation. Paired windows of the same design are placed on the second floor of the east side of the ell.

The east side of the building has an irregular form created by the one-story addition to the ell and the one-story shed addition to the main block. Six-over-six windows matching the overall fenestration design are placed in a symmetrical pattern on this side of the house. An entry and concrete stoop has been placed on the south side of the ell addition and a bay window has been built onto the one-story shed addition on the east.

A modern one-story, three bay garage has been built just to the east of the house.

Summary: The Moore farmhouse, originally built in 1853 with an I-house addition around 1908, no longer conveys its architectural or historical significance as a vernacular farmhouse. It was extensively remodeled into a Colonial Revival house in the 1940s and in 1994 further renovations were completed updating the house into a modern Neoclassical suburban residence. The building neither represents a distinctive type, period and method of historic design or construction nor does it convey its historical associations with the Moore family and their role in the settlement of the area.

Chain of Title/Owner Information:

William Moore built a two story log and frame house at the site about 1853 and soon thereafter conveyed the property to his son Nathaniel. Nathaniel's widow Elizabeth Moore inherited the property in 1876 and in turn conveyed it to her sons. One of the sons, William Moore, acquired sole interest in the property and cultivated the land and raised livestock there until 1882. He sold the farm to William Massey for \$2,000. Massey almost immediately resold the farm for \$2,800 in 1883 to Benjamin Thompson. Thompson settled on the farm and made major improvements adding a complement of outbuildings (no longer extant) and an I-house addition to the ell around 1908.

After Thompson's death in 1913, the property was sold at auction by the executor to Malcolm and Katherine Farquhar for \$8,900. In 1920 the Farquhars sold the property to Andrew and Ethel Thompson. The Thompsons directed the first renovation of the house updating its heating, plumbing and electrical systems and remodeling the house in the Colonial Revival style. In 1955 the farm (87.38 acres) was sold by the Thompsons to Harry and Dora Malasky who in turn sold the house and two acres to James P. Anderson in 1960. The remaining acreage was sold and developed as a subdivision. Anderson sold the house and surrounding two acres to Alfred and Jane Knowles in 1963 and they resold the property to current owners Nicholas and Rose DeCarlo in 1967.

The William Moore House is significant as a mid nineteenth century rural vernacular dwelling which underwent remodeling during mid twentieth century; giving the present structure a Classical Revival appearance. The Classical Revival look is demonstrated in the two story portico, supported by squared columns, located on the facade of the house. It is also significant as the home of the Moore family who were among the early settlers to this area. The farm sat on 72 acres and was referred to as "Atholwood." The original two story farm section of the house (what is now the back) was built by William Moore about 1853.¹ The property was later conveyed to William's son, Nathaniel. After Nathaniel's death, his widow, Elizabeth passed the farm on to their sons in 1876.² One of the sons, William lived here and farmed the land and raised livestock.³

In April of 1882 William and his wife, Mary sold the estate to William Massey for \$2,000.⁴ Massey kept "Atholwood" only a year before selling it to Benjamin Thompson in 1883 for \$2,800.⁵ Between 1908 and 1910 it appears that Thompson made considerable improvements to the house, probably adding what is now the main block. Outbuildings were also added during this time.⁶ When Thompson died in 1913, George Wachtel as executor of his last will and testament sold "Atholwood" at a public auction to Malcolm and Katherine Farquhar for \$8,900. The proceeds were then divided amongst the heirs.⁷

In 1920 the Farquhars sold the property to Andrew and Ethel Thompson.⁸ In 1931 they added a barn to the property.⁹ Then, in 1935, the Thompsons renovated the house, adding central heat, electricity and a modern bathroom and kitchen. Finally, during the 1940's, they remodeled the facade and added shingle siding over the original farm exterior.¹⁰

The Thompsons sold "Atholwood" to Harry and Dora Malasky in October of 1955. By this time the acreage had increased from 72 acres to 87.38 acres.¹¹ Then, in 1960, they sold the house to James P. Anderson on 2.005 acres.¹² The rest of the acreage was sold as lots for the subdivision that now surrounds "Atholwood".

In 1963, Anderson sold the house to Alfred and Jane Knowles.¹³ They sold it in 1967 to the present owners, Nicholas and Rose Marie DeCarlo.¹⁴ The DeCarlos have left the house as it was when they bought it with the exceptions of the replacement of the kitchen fireplace (due to mortar decay) and the placement of aluminum siding on the exterior of the house. The original hand dug well still supplies water to "Atholwood" and the stone walls that surround the house are also original according to Rose Marie DeCarlo.

The main north facade has a two story portico with square columns and a pentagonal window in the pediment. The entrance is also pedimented. The boxed cornice has small returns.


