DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house is a two story, log constructed structure built in several sections. The present central chimney was once the end chimney for a smaller house. Each section is basically a three-bay building with a central entrance. A shed-roofed porch runs across the front; it is a late nineteenth century addition, with turned posts, fan-shaped brackets, and jagg-saw balustrade.

Additions have been made on the south and north end walls, obscuring their original design.

The rear facade has an addition on its north end but the south end retains the original appearance. This section had a door and window on the first floor and a single window on the second.

The house has been covered with aluminum siding and trim. The present windows, probably added when the porch was, are 2/2 double hung sash.

A corncrib on the property rests on stone piers. It has a braced frame joined with pegs and is sheathed with vertical boards and battens. The bank barn has a stone foundation and vertical siding. Arched, louvered openings flank the double sliding doors on the west and east facades; the south gable end also has louvered openings. On the lower level, the joists are half-round logs; the upper levels have braced framing. A scalloped bargeboard runs along the eaves and the sides of the gable ends. A pair of louvered lanterns sit on the ridge of the roof.
