DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The building actually consists of two identical houses joined together. It is a two-story, frame building with rough clapboard siding. Each house has three bays on the main (south) facade, with a central door. There are only two windows in each section at the second-story level. All windows are 6/6, double-hung. There is a simple box-cornice in each part. Both sections share a large stone chimney that sits near the center, but within the east-end wall of the west section. The fireplace-type chimney hints that part of the house may be earlier than it appears (See note under "Statement of Significance".) There are several frame outbuildings and a Negro cemetery nearby.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

One of the very few double houses seen anywhere in the County. The building may be earlier than it first appears, but an interesting item in the MONTGOMERY COUNTY SENTINEL (May 8, 1874) causes questions. The reference mentions war claims made by John L.T. Jones, near Poolesville, for payment for the accidental destruction of his house, while it was occupied by Union troops during the Civil War. It mentions that Jones was a loyal Union man, who gave information to General Hobart Ward, who was quartered in his house.

(There is the possibility that this (present) dwelling may not have actually been Jones' house.)
