DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story frame house stands on the east side of Martinsburg Road with its facade oriented towards the west. The house is located on a small lot with a driveway on the south side of the house and a small yard surrounded by a paling fence in front. The house consists of two story principal block and two story kitchen and bedroom attached to the back length as an L.

The main block has a three bay facade; a door located on the northern side and two windows to the south. Above these openings are three windows for the upstairs. The window openings contain double hung sashes with two over two panes. They are now covered with storm windows. The frame of the house was not examined. In earlier years it was covered with weatherboards, which have now been covered over with green tarpaper insulation. The gable roof is protected by tin. Trim boards accent the corners of the house. There are no windows in either gable end, except for a small louvered opening for ventilation in the attic. Through the center of the roof ascends a brick stove flue.

In plan, of the main block, the interior consists of a two room downstairs and two up with a boxed stairway ascending the east wall of the "front room", the one into which front door opened.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house was built in c.1900 according to Lemuel Graham ("about when I was six years old"), who was born in Martinsburg in 1894. Deeds in the County Courthouse show that in 1906 Gilmore Green and his wife, Martha, conveyed this land to Eliza Fisher "together with the dwelling place house thereon" upn the condition that she hold the property in trust for her children by her marriage with Addie Fisher. The deed supports strongly the oral account of Lemuel Graham, which is significant since Graham is the source of so much of the dating information regarding houses in Martinsburg. (L/F: 188/255, 1906).

The wording of the deed between Gilmore and Martha Green and Eliza Fisher suggests that the Greens were kin to Eliza Fisher, perhaps parents. That possibility should be as a topic included in further historical research since Green was one of the pillars of the Black community in Martinsburg in the 1870's and 80's.

According to the present owner, Emma Diggs Fairfax, her parents (Diggs) from Frederick County, purchased this property from the Fisher family in 1944.
