DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an unusual style of farmhouse that probably contains an earlier dwelling beneath its present (Victorian) appearance. The main section is a three-bay, gable-front facade that faces east. There is a door with sidelights in the north-end bay. The door is framed with a molded architrave. Windows are 2/2, except for the tall, double attic-window in the gable end. This window features round-headed arches and one-over-one glass. There is a stove-type chimney at the peak of the roof, directly above the attic window. The cornice is returned on this (front) facade.

There is a lower, two-story wing set back from the main house, at the NW corner. This features a three-sided bay window on the east side. The present siding is asbestos shingle.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This was another of the prosperous Young family farms during the 19th Century. The adjacent farms of Killmain (destroyed), East Oaks, and the "Woodbine" (Isaac Young farm) were also owned by this family. David Young died August 21, 1879, and presumably this house was built for him before that date.
