DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The house here is a very elegant, Classical Revival home of the early 20th Century. It is a large, square, frame structure of five bays on its main (west) facade. The first story is marked by a wide, open summer porch, that wraps around the north, west and south sides of the building. The porch has a balustrade-type railing, and is supported by round columns.

The central door in the west facade has transom and side-lights. The massive hip roof is offset on this facade by a small center gable that features a Palladian-type window. There are large dormers on the north and south sides, and tall chimney stacks here have flared, drip courses. The main roof, like the porch roof, is of slate.

There are several farm buildings here that blend in with the style of the house. These include a large bank barn, with three cupola vents along the ridge.
