9. Description: This four bay by one bay, two-and-half story frame house faces west. Built on fieldstone foundations, the house has white novelty siding. The west (front) porch has a half hipped roof supported by four turned posts. The west door is glass and wooden paneled. On the east elevation there is a shed roofed porch supported by two chamfered wooden posts and enclosed at the south end. This porch has decorative brackets.

There are two-over-two double hung windows throughout the house flanked by green wooden louvered shutters. There is one small four light window in the north gable end and two small four light windows in the south gable end. The gable roof is covered by raised seam metal. There are two interior chimneys with corbelled caps.

10. Significance: Located in the farming country of upper Montgomery County, the land on which the John Lynch farm lies is associated with early and prominent families. The tract is part of Hanover, first owned by Dr. Patrick Hepburn in 1722. It was sold in 1801 to Laurence Neale, a member of the House of Delegates and Judge of the Orphan's Court. His daughter Eleanor Jamison received the land, but was forced to sell it to pay her debts.

The farm house, built c. 1842 for Charles Smith is a representative 19th century farm dwelling. When Smith died in 1870 the farm was divided among his daughters; Marie Smith Lynch received the house and 30 acres. The farm remained in the Smith/Lynch family for almost 100 years before being sold in 1937. The present owner bought the property in 1948.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Located in the farming country of upper Montgomery County, the John Lynch Farm is a representative 19th century farm dwelling.

In 1722, 1500 acres of land on the headwaters of the Dry Seneca were granted to Dr. Patrick Hepburn, who called his property "Hanover". Sixty years later Dr. Hepburn's descendant, Samuel Hepburn, petitioned the county to resurvey the grant.¹ It was part of this "Resurvey of Hanover" that Hepburn sold to Laurence O'Neale in 1801.²

O'Neale was an important figure in the early politics of Montgomery County. From 1780-1796 he was a member of the House of Delegates and in the early 1790s he was also a Judge of the Orphan's Court. In 1810 O'Neale gave his 364 acres of Hanover to his daughter and son-in-law, Eleanor and Francis Jamison, "for the better maintenance, support, preferment, and advancement of the said Eleanor Jamison."³ However, after her husband's death in 1821 Eleanor was still in debt and was forced to auction off the farm in sections. Each part was assessed at \$7 an acre, yet when section two failed to have a buyer at that price, it was sold to Charles Smith for \$3.41 an acre.⁴ It is believed that the farm house was built at this time for Smith, his wife Mary, and their five daughters.

Smith farmed the land for many years, passing away in 1870. In his will he set down guidelines for the division of his property. His second wife received little and his eldest daughter Mary was given \$100 "and no more". His four youngest daughters were to share the farm equally "until they all mary finly" (sic). After they were married "the farm is to be layd off in four equal parts", excepting however "them that gits houses gets less land."⁵ In 1871 the farm was divided up among the four married daughters; Maria Smith Lynch received only 30 acres, as her section contained the farm house.⁶

John and Maria Lynch bought up several other sections of land over the years and farmed them. At their deaths the property was inherited by son William. In 1937 he sold the farm, ending almost 100 years of ownership in the same family.⁷ The present owner bought the property in 1948.
