A large, two story log house with two rooms up and two rooms down was built on this site in c. 1879 by Lloyd Coates, Sr., a former slave. In c. 1902 his son began construction of a two story frame house of the type popular among Black landowners of that era. The two houses illustrate the shift from home-made houses constructed by the community to frame dwellings made of purchased materials and constructed by hired carpenters, a shift occurring especially near the turn of the century.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

According to Tilghman Lee, Lloyd Coates, Sr. was one of the "old slave-time people", who was among the first of the black landowners of Sugarland. This is supported by land records, which shows Coates' wife Maria purchasing this tract in 1879 from Jane Pleasant whose residence is shown in the Hopkins' Atlas of 1879, Medley District, near the present day Sugarland community.

On this property Coates built a log house. Though it is not exactly remembered by Tilghman Lee, he thinks it resembled the two story, four room house of the Taylor family on the adjacent tract. This seems plausible.

Coates' son, Lloyd Coates, Jr. worked as a tenant farmer on the "Lewis place" near Darnestown. He purchased the property on which his tenant house stood. Afterwards, he inherited his parents' property in 1902 in Sugarland, on which stood this log house. Since he preferred a larger dwelling, he tore down the log house and constructed a two story, frame dwelling with maybe four or five rooms, Lee recalls. However, Coates, Jr. had not included his wife Susan in his plans, and she refused to move from the property near Darnestown to this farm in Sugarland. Sugarland was at that time far less accessible than today, Lee explains, and she probably preferred to live closer to the larger community of Darnestown.

Coates family did not move to Sugarland, and the large house stood vacant and gradually deteriorated until it was torn down by the Umsteads who purchased the property from Susan Coates after Lloyd's death.

Thus there were a log house and a frame one built on this property, and they represented the types built by succeeding generations in the last quarter of the 19th century.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

These two houses of the Coates family represent the transition in housing that often occurs in a frontier settlement: first the log house was built, and as the family became more prosperous, a larger and more commodious frame dwelling was constructed. However, a smooth transition in this housing was called to an abrupt halt by Lloyd Coates Jr's wife, who was an example of at least one woman in that era who refused the Old Testament addage, "Whither thou goest, I wilst follow".

The U.S. Census for 1870 for Montgomery County lists Lloyd (age 35) with wife named Maria. It lists their children as Lloyd (age 4) and Margaret (age 10). This confirms Tilghman Lee's account that there were Lloyd Coates Sr. and Jr. Interestingly, the occupations of Lloyd & Maria Coates were listed as "keeping house"; it is odd that he was not listed as a farm worker or engaged in another occupation.






