DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This was obviously the home of a prosperous farmer. The main block of the house is a large, square section that faces west. The house is two-stories, with a full living-space attic. The main "A" roof is offset by a large center gable on the west (main) facade. A stove-type chimney is centered on the ridge of the main roof. The heavy cornice is returned, and there are pairs of round-headed windows in both gable-ends. Window sash is 2/2, and there are tall, oversized windows at the first floor level. There is a lower, two-story, jetty-type extension on the east, and a long wing of similar height continuing from the north end of the main house.

There is an excellent collection of farm buildings here, including a well-tower with an open, belfry-type of roof (only other one seen in the area is at the Williams Farm (#17-27) on Westerly Road.) There is also a three-story, frame barn, several sheds and corn cribs, and a building that may have housed a blacksmith shop-since it appears to have a large chimney.

(Was not able to examine the farm closely.)

Prepare both a summary paragraph of significance and a general statement of history and support.

The J. Trundle Farmhouse is a large, interesting but somewhat unusual looking rural vernacular dwelling. It is unusual in that there are no other structures which closely resemble this one in the area. It appears to have been constructed in parts which may explain its unique appearance. In addition, the Trundle farm also has an excellent collection of farm buildings among which are a well tower and a three story frame barn. On the whole, the structures found on the Trundle farm are considerable larger than average indicating this was the farm of a prosperous farmer.

The house was built by James T. Trundle about 1876.¹ James built his house on 204 acres of tracts of land referred to as "Resurvey on Carsbasket" and "Resurvey on Blantyre" which he purchased in November of 1873 from John H. and Annie E. Allnutt.² The allnutts owned the adjoining farm; evidently selling off part of their original 366 1/4 acres. James Trundle is listed in Boyd's, History of Montgomery County, Maryland as a farmer. James raised wheat, corn and rye as well as cattle, pigs and horses.³ James lived here with his wife, Elizabeth Ellen until his death in February of 1918. He left the farm, which now totalled 500 acres, to Elizabeth to be passed on to his nephew, Americus Dawson Trundle after her death.⁴ Elizabeth died in February of 1919 and the farm became the property of Americus who resided here with his wife, Lucy until 1927 when the property was foreclosed on. The property was then described as a combination of three farms (one being the "home farm of the late, James Trundle" and the "farm on which A. Dawson Trundle now resides"). The improvements were described as a "large up-to-date dwelling with modern improvements" (the large main block is possibly an early twentieth century addition), large barn about 75'x115', tenant houses, other barns and necessary out-buildings.⁵

The property was sold to the New York Life Insurance Corporation, who held the mortgage. since then the farm has passed through a succession of corporate owners. In October of 1977 it was purchased by the present owner, Joseph A. Muldoon, Jr.⁶
