DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story frame house stood on the south side of the old Jonesville Road. It faced the road (north). According to community informants, Howard Lyles and John Sims, the house was similar in appearance to the Genus house, (#17-6-3) on the opposite side of the road. Like the Genus house, it stood two stories height, contained two rooms down and two up, and the line of its roof was broken by a cross gable pediment. See the photographs of the Genus house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house was representative of a type that was built near the turn of the 19th century by the more prosperous Black landowning families in Montgomery County. It represents the second generation house type, the first generation house type after emancipation being the log house.

Note: Cecilia Noland, daughter of Henry Noland, was the mother of Lorraine Duffin and Edna D. Johnson of the White Grounds community, Boyds. See the descriptions of the Duffin family sites in White Grounds for a history of the Duffin family. Edna Johnson has a family Bible with names and dates of the Noland family.






