**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

This handsome two story house stands on the east side of White Grounds Road. Its front is oriented towards the road facing west. The frame of the house today is sheathed with white asbestos shingles. According to Mrs. Edna Duffin Johnson, the house originally had weatherboards, which were whitewashed. Along the facade of the house is a shed porch which has probably been added. It is supported by large square posts. The facade of the front block of the house contains three bays symmetrically arranged. The window and door trims have been painted light blue as have been the boards that enclose the eaves. The roofline is accented by a cross gable pediment. It contains a small rectangular window.

The interior of the house contained two rooms down and two rooms up and was similar in design to the home built by the Duffin family in the 1890s by the Duffin family. To the back of the house is a two story ell with one room down and one room up. Attached to that is a two story addition, which is of cinderblocks. To the north of the house remains some of the old outbuildings but most of the vestiges of the old farmstead are gone.

## STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to deed 268/195, George O. Hawkins purchased this property of seven acres from Godfrey W. Stivers and his wife in 1917. It was a tract of "Wolf's Cow". According to Mrs. Johnson, George Stivers was a white landowner and George Hawkins was the first Black person to own this land. During the time that the Hawkins family lived here, the house resembled in appearance the home of the Duffin family and of other Black families of moderate means.

The original section of the house appears to have constructed in the 1880s or 1890s.



