DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This plain two story frame house stands on the east side of White Grounds Road on the tract south of the second Duffin home. This is the first home of the Duffin family and is smaller than the house adjacent to it, that they built in 1891.

The frame of this house is now covered with asbestos shingles, but originally was covered with board and batten siding. The house consisted of a two story principal block with a three bay facade. Unlike most houses of this type, the openings in the facade were not symmetrically arranged. Instead the door was located off-center. The windows contained double-hung sashes with the typical 6 x 6 lights. The facade was sheltered by a shed porch supported by debarked saplings. The cornices are boxed with plain boards and the roof covered by corrugated tin. A cinder block stove flue was built through the middle of the house.

To the back of the house has been added a two-story ell containing one room down and one room up. And next to it was added a one-story room.

To the north of the house is a small outbuilding, which was probably the meat house. To the south was a privy and another small frame outbuilding which may have been the hen house. There were probably other outbuildings, gardens and work places around the house, but these are no longer evident.



