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DESCRIPTION: This house has original German siding and pressed tin roof in fishscale pattern, boxed cornice and ogee molding. The windows have plain wide surrounds. The facade has an L-shaped porch extending around the left elevation, supported by four posts with decorative scroll brackets, raised seam tin roof. In the left bay, there is a long, narrow 2/2 window, middle bay 2/2 window, right bay is door with one-light transom.

The second story facade has a 2/2 window in each of three bays equally spaced.

Right elevation-first bay, small rectangular window; middle bay, rectangular bay, one-storey with narrow 1/1 double windows; right bay, enclosed porch with modern windows. Second storey has small diamond-shaped window in first bay, 2/2 in middle bay, addition over enclosed porch with 2/2 in third bay. Gable end has imbricated shingles and small rectangular window.

Rear elevation-left bay, enclosed porch; right bay, 2/2 window. Second storey, added room, 2/2 window, right bay, 2/2. Gable has no shingles or window and appears smaller than front gable.

Left elevation-Porch extends from front of house, side door and 2/2 window, two-storey rectangular bay with two narrow 1/1 windows in middle bay.
